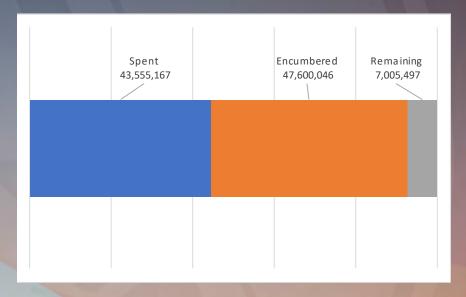


2021 Capital Budget Overview

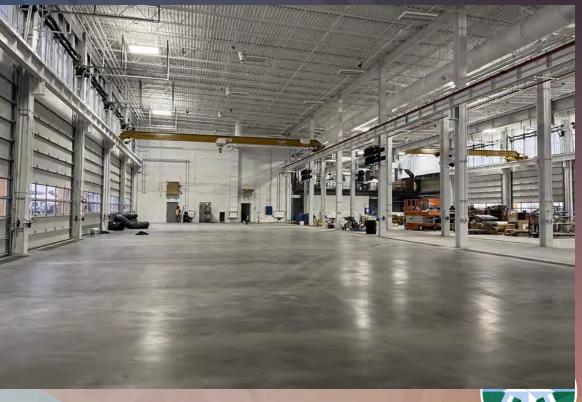

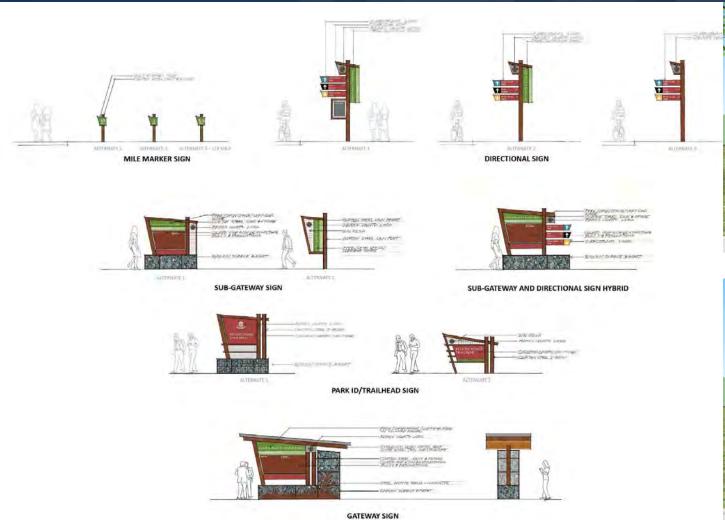

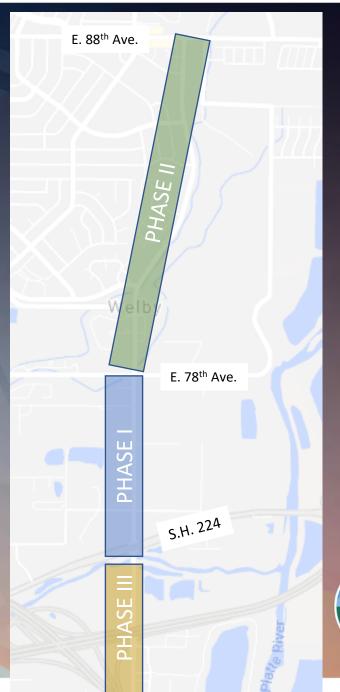






York Street (Phases I, II, III)

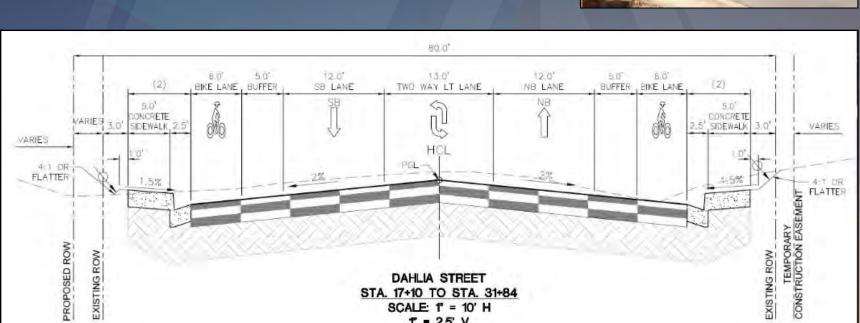

DISCUSSION POINTS:

- In 2021, the Board of County Commissioners (BoCC) requested staff to create an in-house committee to review the Community Enrichment Grant applications each year and provide recommendations to the BoCC.
- The Adams County Foundation has served as the grant advisory committee for the Community Enrichment Grant since 2017.
- The new committee will accept applications for the Community Enrichment Grant, review the applications, and make a recommendation to the BoCC on the projects to fund.
- Staff have drafted a composition of the advisory committee and would like feedback from the BoCC on the proposal.

Background

Community Enrichment Grant

- Financial support to nonprofit organizations to serve County residents with basic needs and promote self-sufficiency
- o Budget for grant approved each year by the BoCC

Adams County Foundation - 501(c)(3) organization

o Dispersed the Community Enrichment Grant funds

In 2021, BoCC decided to move the Community Enrichment Grant to an internal grant program.



Grant Advisory Committee

Proposed Composition

- Minimum = 5 community members; Maximum = 13 members
- Members appointed by the Board of County Commissioners
- Two-year terms
- 1 member shall be from unincorporated Adams County.
- Up to 12 residents could represent different cities in Adams County. Strive to limit to 1 representative per city to promote inclusivity.



Grant Advisory Committee

Proposed Skills

- At least 1 member shall have experience working in a nonprofit organization, a social service program, or a private foundation*
- At least 1 member shall have financial expertise*
- Applicants to the committee who have experience with grant writing, administration, or evaluation will be given preference

*Members with specialized expertise may also serve as representatives from a city



Recommended Next Steps

- 1. BoCC creates Grant Advisory Committee by resolution
- 2. The 2022 Community Enrichment Grant program operates over the next six months with the Adams County Foundation Board members as the Grant Advisory Committee to ensure 2022 grant applicants can receive funding this summer
- 3. Advertise for members to the new Grant Advisory Committee in the summer
- 4. Appoint the new Grant Advisory Committee members in the fall for the 2023 program

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Board Chair or Interim County Manager to sign the DRCOG TIP form

DISCUSSION POINTS:

- The City and County of Broomfield is requesting financial support for a TIP project they are planning to submit to DRCOG for Federal funds as part of the DRCOG FY 2022-2025 TIP "Call #1". Elements of the project build off of the SH 7 Corridor Development Plan performed in 2021.
- As defined, the Broomfield project seeks to complete design and pre-construction activities near the interchange of I-25 and SH 7 specific to Adams County, the intersections at Holly and Quebec Streets. A request to the City of Thornton was also submitted. The AdCOG Subregional Forum discussed the financial request and declined to offer match funds; however, the Forum did provide non-financial support.
- Broomfield staff notified Adams County Public Works staff that if the financial contribution was not submitted by Adams County that the intersections of Holly & Quebec may not be included within the project scope.
- Broomfield is requesting two items: (1) financial support from Adams County in the amount \$117,500 as part of the required DRCOG match, and (2), signature on the DRCOG TIP Concurrence Form showing support for the project(s). These items are exclusive of each other.
- The application deadline is Friday, March 18, 2022. Adams County staff informed our partners that given the short deadline we may not be able to financially contribute at this time. Typical presentation of financial commitments requires presentation of this request at a formal study session with appropriate lead times for presentation of the information to the ELT and BoCC.

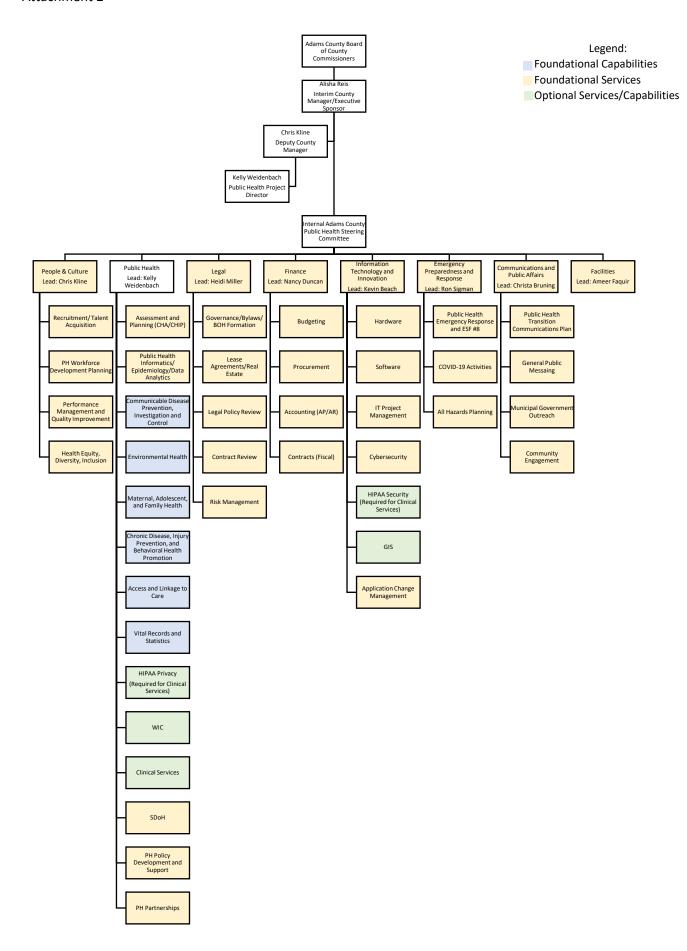
