THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between the County of Adams, State of Colorado, hereinafter called "County" and North Side Gardens Llc., hereinafter called "Developer".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Developer is the owner of real property in the County of Adams, State of Colorado, as described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, and by this reference made a part hereof. The legal description for said real property is as follows:

WHEREAS, it is provided by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, that where designated the Developer shall have entered into a written agreement with the County to install public and/or private improvements, and to deed land for public purposes or right-of-way.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the parties hereto promise, covenant, and agree as follows:

- 1. Engineering Services. Developer shall furnish, at its own expense, all engineering and other services in connection with the design and construction of the improvements described and detailed on Exhibit "B2" attached hereto, and by this reference made a part hereof.
- 2. **Drawings and Estimates**. The Developer shall furnish drawings and cost estimates for all improvements described and detailed on Exhibits "B1-East 73rd Avenue" and "B2-Gilpin Way" for approval by the County. Upon request the Developer shall furnish one set of reproducible "as built" drawings and a final statement of construction costs to the County.
- 3. Construction. Developer shall furnish and construct, at its own expense and in accordance with drawings and materials approved by the County, the improvements described and detailed on Exhibit "B2-Gilpin Way".
- 4. **Highway 224 Improvements.** Developer has proposed to construct roadway and traffic improvements to Highway 224, in the area of the Gilpin Way intersection. Highway 224 is under the jurisdiction of the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT). Developer is entirely responsible for creation of the construction documents, receiving plan approval from CDOT and approval of the constructed improvements from CDOT.
- 5. **Time for Completion**. Improvements shall be completed according to the terms of this agreement within "construction completion date" appearing below. The County may for good cause, grant extension of time for completion of any part or all of improvements appearing on said Exhibit "B2". Any extension of time shall be in written form only.
- 6. Guarantee of Compliance. Developer shall furnish to the County a cash escrow deposit or other acceptable collateral, releasable only by the County, to guarantee compliance with this agreement. Said collateral shall be in the amount of \$205,128, including twenty percent (20%) to cover administration and five percent (5%) per year for the term of the Agreement to cover inflation. Upon approval of the final plat, completion of said improvements constructed according to the terms of this agreement, and preliminary acceptance by the BoCC in accordance with section 5-02-06-01 of the County's Development Standards and Regulations, the collateral shall be released. Completion of said improvements shall be determined solely by the County, and a reasonable part of said collateral, up to 20%, may be retained to guarantee maintenance of public improvements for a period of one year from the date of completion.

- 7. Acceptance and Maintenance of Public Improvements. All improvements designated "public" on Exhibit "B" shall be public facilities and become the property of the County or other public agencies upon acceptance. During the period of one year from and after the acceptance of public improvements, the Developer shall, at its own expense, make all needed repairs or replacement due to defective materials or workmanship which, in the opinion of the County, shall become necessary. If, within ten days of written notice to the Developer from the County requesting such repairs or replacements, the Developer shall not have undertaken with due diligence to make the same, the County may make such repairs or replacements at the Developer's expense. In the case of an emergency such written notice may be waived.
- 8. Successors and Assigns. This agreement shall be binding upon the heirs, executors, personal representatives, successors, and assigns of the Developer, and shall be deemed a covenant running with the real property as described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.
- 9. **Improvements and Dedication**. The undersigned Developer hereby agrees to provide the following improvements, and to dedicate described property.
 - A. Improvements. Designate separately each public and private improvement.

The Developer hereby agrees to pay cash in lieu of constructing East 73rd Avenue Public Improvements.

Gilpin Way Public Improvements:

Road (paving, curb/gutter/sidewalk) with related Drainage Improvements on the east side of Gilpin Way 600± lineal feet in length abutting NORTH SIDE GARDENS BUSINESS PARK FILING II Subdivision (Existing County Parcel # 0171935400033) See Exhibit "B2" for description, estimated quantities and estimated construction costs.

The improvements shall be constructed in accordance with all County requirements and specifications in accordance with the approved plans and time schedule as indicated in Exhibit "B".

- B. Public dedication of land for right-of-way purposes or other public purpose. Upon approval of this agreement by the Board of County Commissioners, the Developer hereby agrees to convey by warranty deed to the County of Adams the following described land for right-of-way or other public purposes:
 - 10' of additional right-of-way on the south side of E. 73rd Avenue abutting NORTH SIDE GARDENS BUSINESS PARK FILING II Subdivision (Existing County Parcel # 0171935400033) as well as the eastern 60 feet of said property to be dedicated as Outlot C for County Drainage purposes. A 10 foot pedestrian access easement to be dedicated along the additional 10 foot of right of way on the south side of E. 73rd Avenue across the entire lot frontage.
- 10. Mazzotti Industrial Tract #2-1994 Development Agreement: The 1994 Development Agreement and conditions therein shall apply to the current development, unless modified below.
 - 1. Access: No access shall be allowed on East 73rd Avenue and all primary access shall be from SH224. The NSGBP-II Subdivision complies with these requirements.
 - 2. Plat Required: Prior to development of this property, an acceptable plat of the property is required, together with following requirements, and any other outstanding requirements of the plat approval, must be approved by Adams County. In accordance with this requirement, the property is being platted as the NSGBP-II Subdivision. Other platting requirements of the Mazzotti Industrial Tract #2-1994 Development Agreement are being satisfied, where applicable, or are still applicable to the NSGBP-II Subdivision as follows:
 - a. Submittal of Final Drainage Plan Completed as part of approvals of the final plat of the NSGBP-II Subdivision.
 - b. Reservation of s necessary wide area for the future acquisition by the UD&FCD and Adams County for construction of a drainage channel. Required of necessary wide area for future drainage channel dedicated to Adams County by NSGBP-II Subdivision.
 - c. Resubmittal of Preliminary Drainage Report Completed as part of approvals of the preliminary plat of the NSGBP-II Subdivision.

- d. Dedication of 20 feet of right-of-way (30' from the Land Line) for East 73rd Avenue. *Dedicated by NSGBP-II Subdivision final plat*.
- e. Execution of a Development Agreement to guarantee construction of all required street improvements and drainage facilities. E. 73rd Avenue roadway and drainage improvements are satisfied by execution of this SIA and to guarantee said improvements at such time as directed to do so by Adams County.
- f. Amendment to the plat layout as follows:
 - 1. Depict proposed High Street Extension north of SH224 as a local industrial cross-section and terminate in a cul-de-sac. (Extension of this roadway north to intersect E. 73rd Avenue will not be provided until East 73rd Avenue between High Street and Washington Street and street improvement noted in paragraph 1 above are completed.).
 - 2. Depict only one lot, or in the alternative, a lot layout that provides acceptable access to all internal lots and provides for extension of E. 73rd Avenue when road improvements are made.

No access is provided to E. 73rd, except for emergency vehicles. Gilpin Street replaced High Street and was previously extended to E. 73rd by other County approvals after approval of Mazzotti Industrial Tract #2-1994 Development Agreement (Case No. 131-94-ZP). All lots within NSGBP-Phase II access to only Gilpin Street and this SIA provides for construction of improvements to that portion of E. 73rd Avenue abutting the NSGBP-II Subdivision to include related drainage improvements at such time as directed to do so by Adams County after preparation and approval of plans to improve E. 73rd Avenue between Washington and York Streets.

- 3. <u>Landscaping and Buffering:</u> In addition to the minimum standards of the Adams County Zoning Regulations, the following shall be incorporated into any landscape plan required prior to construction on this property.
 - a. A minimum of 15% of the lot shall be landscaped and a minimum of 30 feet of area shall be landscaped adjacent to any right-of-way.

- b. Landscaping shall consist of a minimum of 1 tree and 2 shrubs per 700s square feet of required landscaped area.
- c. In accordance with, and in addition to, the requirements of Section 12.400 of the Adams County Zoning Regulations, lesser intensity adjacent uses shall be buffered from development on this lot through the installation of additional landscape area consisting of two trees and four shrubs per 500 square feet of required buffer area and installation of berms and/or walls. At a minimum, an eight foot solid wood fence shall be installed along East 73rd Avenue behind the required landscape area. Specific buffering plans shall be submitted for review with the application for any building permit on the property.

The requirements were addressed in the Site Plan submitted with Preliminary Plat approved in Case No. PLT2015-00021 that included 30+ feet of landscaping & buffer area with a paved walking/bicycle trail, $4\pm$ foot berming, and compliance with the intent of the 6' wooden fence by building construction in conformance #4 Building Materials Standards along E. 73^{rd} Avenue.

- 4. Building Materials: 100% of the exterior of the building on the north and west elevations shall incorporate architectural design elements such as textured concrete, brick, stone, split faced concrete block, wood and glass. Still applicable.
- 5. Building Height: Not applicable, except the maximum height of any structure shall still be in according to the requirements of the Adams County I-1 Industrial Zone District.
- 6. Uses: Uses permitted shall be those listed as a Use-by-Right in the I-1 Industrial Zone District in the use charts of the Adams County Zoning Regulations. *Still applicable*.
- 7. Other Standards: Unless otherwise modified by this agreement, all standards and restrictions of the I-1, industrial zone district, Adams County, shall apply. *Still applicable*.
- 8. Drawings and Estimates: The Developer shall furnish drawings and cost estimates for all improvements described herein for approval by the County. Upon request, the Developer shall furnish one set of reproducible "as built" drawings and a final statement of construction costs to the County. Still applicable.

- 9. Construction: The Developer shall furnish and construct, at his own expense and in accordance with drawings and materials approved by the County, the improvements described herein. *Still applicable*.
- 10. Time for Completion: The Developer hereby agrees that the property shall be developed in full compliance with items 1 through 9 above prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy for the building. Furthermore, approval of any future building permits or change in use permits shall also be subject to compliance with items 1 through 9 above. The County may for good cause, grant extension of time for completion of any part or all of these items. Any extension of time shall be in written form only. Still applicable.
- 11. Successors and Assigns: This agreement shall be binding upon the heirs, executors, personal representatives, successors, and assigns of the developer, for the real property described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.

SUMMARY:

This First Amendment to License Agreement is necessary for the Hoffman Drainageway Improvements Project ("the Project"). It has been reviewed by the County Attorney's office, approved by the Colorado Agricultural Ditch Company, approved the Urban Drainage and Flood Control District, and approved by the Regional Rail Partners, Joint Venture. An original of the First Amendment to License Agreement is attached that has already been signed by Ken McKenzie, Executive Director Urban Drainage and Flood Control District, and David Trent, Project Director Regional Rail Partners, Joint Venture. The ditch company will be the last to sign this First Amendment.

First Amendment to License Agreement extends the dates of completion and defines the schedule to resolve the ownership and maintenance responsibilities for the crossing structures built by the Hoffman drainageway Project.

BACKGROUND:

The Hoffman Drainageway crosses under the Colorado Agricultural Ditch, which is owned and operated by the Colorado Agricultural Ditch Company, a Colorado mutual ditch company (referred to as "the Ditch Company"). The Ditch Company purports to have a prescriptive easement allowing them to operate their facilities that cross the Project. The Ditch Company's procedures require the License Agreement that defines the terms and details of construction as it pertains to their facilities and prescriptive easement. The construction details of the Project at the crossing of the Colorado Agricultural Ditch have been reviewed and approved by the Ditch Company.

The Project begins just south of East 88th Avenue, across from Thornton's Hoffman Way (T-intersection), and terminates approximately 400 feet east and south of the Steele Street and East 86th Avenue intersection (approximately 150 feet east of the Lower Clear Creek Ditch). The project has a total length of approximately 4,800 feet. The Project consists of excavation along the channel; removal of a failing corrugated metal pipe; installation of erosion protection; construction of four concrete box culverts (Rainbow Avenue, Devonshire Boulevard, Encon's access road, and Steele Street); accommodations for the Colorado Agricultural Ditch crossing and a new structure for the Lower Clear Creek Ditch crossing. The Project will ultimately remove the floodplain from structures currently impacted by the Hoffman Drainageway 100-year floodplain.

This Project was discussed in Study Session on May 31, 2016. Subsequently, an agreement with Urban Drainage and Flood Control District (UDFCD) was approved at Public Hearing on October 11, 2016, authorizing and funding the Project. Through that agreement, the project is being managed by UDFCD.

WHEREAS, the Colorado Agricultural Ditch Company, a Colorado mutual ditch company ("Ditch Company"); Adams County, a political subdivision of the State of Colorado ("County"); Urban Drainage and Flood Control District ("District"), a quasi-municipal corporation and political subdivision of the State of Colorado, and Regional Rail Partners, Joint Venture ("RRP"), sometimes referred to collectively herein as the "Parties", have collaborated on the crossing details of the Hoffman Drainageway Improvements ("Project") and the crossing details to Colorado Agricultural Ditch Improvements ("Ditch"); and,

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to enter into the attached First Amendment to License Agreement ("First Amendment"), which extends deadlines and makes changes to the maintenance obligations as outlined in the First Amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the First Amendment To License Agreement Between Colorado Agricultural Ditch Company, Adams County, Urban Drainage And Flood Control District, and Regional Rail Partners, Joint Venture, a copy of which is attached hereto, be hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board of County Commissioners is hereby authorized to execute said Agreement on behalf of Adams County.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO LICENSE AGREEMENT BETWEEN COLORADO AGRICULTURAL DITCH COMPANY, ADAMS COUNTY, URBAN DRAINAGE AND FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT, AND REGIONAL RAIL PARTNERS, JOINT VENTURE

- 1. **PARTIES.** The parties to this First Amendment to License Agreement between Colorado Agricultural Ditch Company, Adams County, Urban Drainage and Flood Control District, and Regional Rail Partners, Joint Venture ("First Amendment") are the Colorado Agricultural Ditch Company, a Colorado mutual ditch company (referred to as "the Ditch Company"); Adams County, a political subdivision of the State of Colorado ("County"); Urban Drainage and Flood Control District ("District"), a quasi-municipal corporation and political subdivision of the State of Colorado; and Regional Rail Partners, Joint Venture ("RRP"). The Ditch Company, the County, the District, and RRP are sometimes referred to collectively herein as the "Parties." The County, the District, and RRP are sometimes referred to collectively herein as the "Cooperating Parties." The effective date of this First Amendment is the date upon which all Parties have completely signed it ("Effective Date").
- 2. **RECITALS.** The Ditch Company, the County, the District, and RRP are parties to an April 4, 2017 License Agreement ("License Agreement") regarding construction of improvements to the Hoffman Drainageway at the location where it crosses the Colorado Agricultural Ditch ("Ditch"). The Parties acknowledge that the Hoffman Drainageway construction project has been delayed, and therefore the Parties have agreed to extend certain deadlines set forth in the License Agreement.
- 3. ONE-YEAR EXTENSION OF DEADLINES IN SECTIONS 3.8, 3.8.1, 3.8.2, AND 3.9. The first two sentences of Section 3.8, and the entirety of Sections 3.8.1, 3.8.2, and 3.9 of the License Agreement are amended as follows:
 - 3.8 The Cooperating Parties agree that the construction permitted hereunder shall proceed with reasonable diligence from the initiation of such construction to its completion, except that construction that interrupts water flow in the Ditch will not be allowed during the period from March 15, 2018 through November 1, 2018. The Installation shall be completed by March 1, 2019. [The remainder of Section 3.8 of the License Agreement is unchanged].
 - 3.8.1 The Cooperating Parties recognize that the Ditch Company customarily does not allow any construction that interrupts water flow in the Ditch during the period from March 15th through November 1st of any given year. However, the Ditch Company is willing to make an exception to allow construction of the Temporary Bypass and the Installation during the period from March 15 through November 1, 2018, if and only if (1) the Ditch Company is able to verify that the applicable portion of the Ditch may be shut off during construction of the Temporary Bypass; (2) the Ditch Company provides written approval of the construction schedule for both the Temporary Bypass and the Installation; and (3) the Ditch Company inspects and provides written acceptance of the Temporary Bypass pursuant to section 3.10, prior to any work being commenced on the Installation.

- 3.8.2 If the Installation is completed during the period from March 15 through November 1, 2018, RRP may remove the Temporary Bypass during that same period if and only if (1) the Ditch Company inspects and provides written acceptance of the Installation pursuant to section 3.10; and (2) the Ditch Company is able to shut off the applicable portion of the Ditch, as necessary, to allow RRP to remove the Temporary Bypass to allow delivery of water through the Installation. If the Temporary Bypass is not so removed during the period from March 15 through November 1, 2018, then RRP shall coordinate with the Ditch Company to remove it during the period from November 1, 2018 through March 1, 2019.
- 3.9 If the Cooperating Parties commence construction of the Installation but fail to complete said construction by March 1, 2019, then RRP shall pay a penalty to the Ditch Company in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) per day until completion. The payment of such penalty shall be in addition to any sums owed as damages hereunder, including but not limited to damages pursuant to section 3.8.
- 4. **REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES.** The Parties agree that the reimbursement provisions of Section 4 of the License Agreement apply to this First Amendment.
- 5. **RECORDATION.** This First Amendment shall be recorded at the expense of the Cooperating Parties. The original of this First Amendment shall be returned to the Secretary of the Ditch Company after it has been recorded.
- 6. **MAINTENANCE, REPAIR, AND REPLACEMENT.** Section 6.1, 6.1.1, 6.1.2, 6.4 and 6.5 shall remain unchanged and Sections 6.2 and 6.3 of the License Agreement are amended as follows:
 - 6.2 Prior to the expiration of the first year of the two year warranty period, the County and the Ditch Company agree to negotiate in good faith to reach a written agreement regarding the rights and obligations associated with ownership and responsibility for operation, maintenance, and replacement of the Installation ("Maintenance Agreement") after expiration of the warranty period.
 - 6.3 If no Maintenance Agreement has been reached after the expiration of one year of the warranty period ("Negotiation Expiration Date"), the County, the Ditch Company, or both may seek a judgment from the Adams County District Court to declare the rights and obligations associated with ownership and responsibility for operation, maintenance, and replacement of the Installation after expiration of the warranty period ("Declaratory Judgment"). Until the earlier of the date by which a Maintenance Agreement has been fully signed by both the County and the Ditch Company or the date by which a final, unappealable Declaratory Judgment has been entered by the Adams County District Court, the County and the Ditch Company agree to confer with one another regarding maintenance of the Installation. After such conferral (unless an emergency situation arises, in which case it may not be possible to confer), the County, the Ditch Company, or both, may take any action deemed reasonably necessary to maintain the Installation.

Each party shall pay its own attorneys fees and costs for the Declaratory Judgment contemplated by this Section 6.3.

- 7. **COMPLETE AGREEMENT.** As amended herein, the License Agreement remains in full force and effect. This First Amendment and the License Agreement together represent the complete agreement of the Parties hereto and no oral modification shall be recognized. Any amendments or additions shall be made in writing signed by the parties.
- 8. **COUNTERPARTS.** This First Amendment may be executed in several counterparts, the signatures on which may be by facsimile or by scanned originals, and, as so executed, shall constitute one agreement, binding on each party even though each party has not signed the same counterpart. Any counterpart of this First Amendment which has attached to it separate signature pages, which altogether contain the signatures of each party, shall be deemed a fully executed instrument for all purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the attached Permanent Drainage Easement from Front Range RV Storage, LLC, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, be and hereby is accepted.

PERMANENT DRAINAGE EASEMENT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That Front Range RV Storage LLC, whose legal address is 6159 S. Kincaid Street, Bennett, Colorado,, hereinafter called "Grantor", for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, does hereby grant, bargain, and convey to the COUNTY OF ADAMS, STATE OF COLORADO, a body politic, whose address is 4430 South Adams County Parkway, Brighton, Colorado 80601 hereinafter "County", its successors and assigns, a permanent storm water drainage easement for the purpose of maintenance of all drainage facilities including inlets, pipes, culverts, channels, ditches, hydraulic structures, detention basins, catch grates, maintenance roads, etc., said easement to be used solely in the event Grantor fails to maintain such drainage facilities, together with lateral and subjacent support thereto as may from time to time be required on, over, across, and through the following described land to wit:

Legal description as set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated by this reference.

Together with the right to ingress and egress over and across the land of Grantor by means of roads and lanes thereon if such there be; otherwise by such route as shall cause the least practical damage and inconvenience to the Grantor.

In further consideration hereof, Grantor covenants and agrees that no permanent buildings or structures will be placed, erected, installed or permitted upon said easement that will cause any obstructions to prevent the proper maintenance and use of said drainage facility.

In the event the County exercises its right to maintain the detention pond, all of the County's costs to maintain the detention pond shall be reimbursed by Grantor within thirty days of receiving the County's invoice, including any collection costs and attorney fees.

In further consideration of the granting of this easement, it is hereby agreed that all work performed by the County, its successors and assigns, in connection with this easement shall be done with care, and the surface of the property shall be restored to its original condition, or as close thereto as possible, except as necessarily modified to accommodate the facilities and appurtenances installed and any damages caused on said easement arising out of the reconstruction, maintenance and repair of said drainage facilities and appurtenances in the exercise of the rights hereby provided shall be restored reasonably similar to its original condition following completion of the work performed.

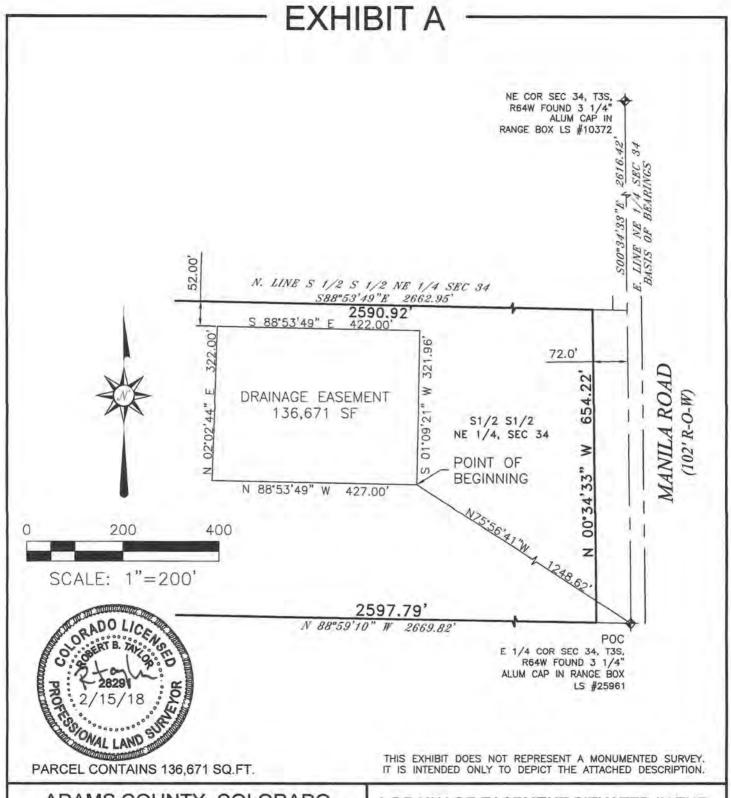

BACKGROUND:

On April 17, 2017, at a study session of the Board of County Commission (BoCC), staff discussed research findings of permitting requirements of the County and other jurisdictions for temporary use permits for sale of fireworks. During the study session, staff recommended a set of revisions to the County's Development Standards and Regulations to increase clarity and to enhance the safety and welfare of the residents of the County. At the Board's direction, staff is proceeding with proposed revisions to the County's Development Standards and Regulations. The proposed changes are scheduled to be considered by the Planning Commission on May 10, 2018 and the Board of County Commissioners on May 22, 2018. In the interim, while the text amendments are pending review and adoption, staff is recommending the BOCC adopt a 30-day moratorium on accepting permit applications for fireworks stands and tents until the final hearing on these regulations. This recommendation for a moratorium is to avoid confusion while the regulations are under review, as well as the potential approval of temporary use permits that could exacerbate issues and concerns that the revisions to the Development Standards are intended to address.

WHEREAS, the Adams County Community and Economic Development Department is developing amendments to the County's Development Standards and Regulations to enhance the requirements of the County's Development Standards; and,

WHEREAS, during the pendency of the proposed amendments to the County's Development Standards and Regulations there exists the potential to issue temporary use permits that could exacerbate the County's concerns regarding the operation of temporary firework stands/tents; and.

WHEREAS, in order to avoid additional confusion and the potential for litigation, and in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Adams County, the Board of County Commissioners believes that it is necessary to institute a thirty-day moratorium on the review and issuance of temporary use permits for the sale of fireworks (fireworks stands/tents) to allow time for the County's Development Standards and Regulations to be amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the Community and Economic Development Department shall not accept for review any applications or issue any temporary use permits for the sale of fireworks for a thirty day period following adoption of this resolution.

The Board of County Commissioners awarded the original Agreement to Ascent Aviation Group d.b.a. World Fuel on December 10, 2015 to provide marketing efforts, up-to-date training to the line service personnel, fuel quality training, customer service training, signage, lease or purchase opportunities for fuel trucks, uniform support, and Point of Sale (POS) credit card processing, annual inspections, quality assurance assistance, technical support, and parts support as part of their services.

Front Range Airport is requesting to extend the agreement with Ascent Aviation Group d.b.a. World Fuel to provide Jet A fuel for jet and turbine aircraft, and Avgas (100LL) for piston aircraft for three months, until the new solicitation is awarded.

The Ascent Aviation Group d.b.a. World Fuel is paid the market price at the time of delivery and resale, with a margin mark-up per gallon averaging \$2.00 for Jet A and \$1.72 for AvGas. Estimated aviation fuel costs for both Jet A fuel and Avgas (100LL) are included within the FRA expenditure budget. Off-setting revenue estimates are included within the FRA revenue budget.

SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

Background:

The applicant, Discovery DJ Services, has a lease agreement with the property owners to operate a gathering system and compressor facility ("Compressor Station") on approximately 10 acres of the subject property. The subject request is for a conditional use permit to allow the construction of a natural gas compressor station on the property.

According to the applicant, compressor stations are facilities located along a natural gas pipeline which compress the gas to a specified pressure, thus allowing it to travel along the pipeline for several miles to its ultimate destination, such as to a refinery, for further processing and distribution. Generally, the number of compressor stations required to move natural gas varies from region to region and associated conditions, such as topography and elevation. The diameter of the associated pipeline and the supply and demand also sometimes determine the number of required compressor stations along the pipeline.

The compressor station is proposed to occupy approximately 10 acres of a 35 acre site and will be developed in two phases. Phase One will consist of four compressors, one slug catcher, metering equipment, dehydration equipment, and venting towers on approximately 2.5 acres. According to the applicant, Phase Two will be developed immediately south of the phase one area on approximately 2.5 acres. Development of this phase is anticipated to occur within the next 20 years, or as demand for natural gas resources increases, and will contain additional compressors and associated equipment. The site plan show the compressor station will be setback approximately 179 feet from Powhaton Road, 157 feet from the north property line, 329 feet from the south property line, and over 1,380 feet from the west property line. Each of the four compressors for Phase One will be in an enclosed building with insulated walls to reduce ambient noise. The applicant also provided a landscape and screening plan for the proposed use. This plan shows approximately 45,264 square feet of landscape area, which equates to ten percent of the total site area. The plan shows 26 trees and 171 shrubs will be installed. This conforms to Section 4-16 of the County's Development Standards. Irrigation for the proposed landscaping will be through automatic irrigation system. An eight foot tall stamped concrete wall is also proposed to be constructed on the perimeter of the site to screen the equipment. The wall is proposed to have a decorative brick design stamped into the concrete to enhance the visual aesthetics of the site.

The subject proposed compressor station is associated with the Boardwalk Pipeline located adjacent to the site, and along the east side of Powhaton Road. The Board of County Commissioners approved the Boardwalk Pipeline on December 13, 2016. The pipeline is a 12 mile line that transports crude oil and natural gas from a Central Delivery Point (CDP) facility, located at East 136th Avenue and Highway 85, to Weld County. The pipeline is part of a larger network of infrastructure that gathers, processes, and transports crude oil and natural gas resources throughout the County.

Site Characteristic:

The subject property is approximately 35 acres and located three-quarters of a mile south of the intersection of E. 152^{nd} Ave. and Powhaton Rd. Currently, the site is undeveloped. The area proposed for the compressor station is located on the western portion of the site on approximately 10 acres. Access to the site is through Powhaton Road.

The site is also located in the Airport Noise and Height Overlays. Per Section 3-33 and 3-35 of the County's Development Standards, the purpose of these sections is to provide for protection of residential and non-residential land uses in areas which may be subjected to frequent overflights by aircraft flying low to the ground upon takeoff or landing at nearby aviation facilities, such as Denver International Airport located approximately 3 miles south of the subject site. The Airport Height Overlay (AHO) requires a Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) aeronautical study to determine if the proposed development could be a hazard to air navigation. The applicant provided a letter from the Federal Aviation Administration with a Determination that there will be No Hazard to Air Navigation by the proposed compressor station and associated equipments.

In addition, the Airport Noise Overlay (ANO) restricts certain land uses, specifically development that may include occupied buildings, to reduce conflicts associated with noise levels generated by airport uses. The proposed development does not include any occupied buildings. In addition, the development will not produce glare or attract wildlife, and will not be detrimental to flight operations.

Development Standards and Regulations Requirements:

The property is zoned Agriculture-3 (A-3). These areas are intended to provide land primarily in holdings of at least 35 acres for dryland or irrigated farming, pasturage, or other related food production uses. Per Section 3-10-040-5, a conditional use permit is required for development of major energy facility in the A-3 district. Section 11-02-329 of the County's regulations defines major energy facilities as, "Transmission lines, power plants, and substations; gas processing plants, and related storage areas providing fossil fuels, manufactured gas, or other petroleum derivatives; microwave installations; and pipelines above ground in excess of one (1) mile in length." The proposed compressor station development is a component of the overall system for gathering, transporting, and processing fossil fuels and other petroleum derivatives throughout the County.

Conditional Use Permit:

Section 2-02-08-06 of the County's Development Standards and Regulations outlines the criteria for approval of a conditional use permit. These include compliance with the County's Development Standards and Regulations; compatibility with the surrounding area, the request must be permitted in the zone district, and must address all off-site impacts. In addition, the proposed use shall be harmonious with the character of the neighborhood, and must not be detrimental to the immediate area, not detrimental to the future development of the area, not detrimental to the health, safety, or welfare of the inhabitants of the area and the County. The conditional use shall not result in excessive traffic generation, noise, vibration, dust, glare, odors,

or inappropriate hours of operation. Further, the site must be suitable for the conditional use including adequate usable space, adequate access, and absence of environmental constraints.

Major energy facilities may be permitted in the A-3 zone district through approval of a conditional use permit. The purpose of a conditional use permit is to evaluate a proposed use for consistency with the applicable zone district, the Comprehensive Plan, and compatibility with surrounding development. Per Section 3-07-01 of the County's Development Standards, major energy facilities are classified as industrial uses and operations associated with such uses are often of higher in intensity due to noise, odor, dust, traffic, and hours of operation associated with the use. The applicant's written explanation and site plan addresses likely impacts of noise, odor, hours of operation of the use, and visual mitigation of the site.

According to the applicant, the facility will be designed to mitigate nuisances that may be associated with the project. The 10 acre site will be surrounded by screen fencing and landscape to provide visual aesthetics and security. In addition, only 2.5 acres of the total lease area will be utilized for the on-site equipments, with the remaining area serving as a buffer between the adjacent properties. The four proposed compressors will be enclosed within insulated structures to provide noise mitigation. According to the application documents, there will be minimal to no odor associated with the facility. In addition, there will be routine inspections to ensure all equipment is functioning properly and mitigate potential nuisance conditions whenever there is such occurrence.

Traffic generated from the use will be limited after the initial construction phase. During this initial construction of the facility, approximately two-hundred and fifty (250) vehicle trips per day are expected to occur on the road network. The initial construction is expected to last for two month. Once the site is constructed, maintenance staff would perform routine inspections between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm with a maximum of two vehicle trips per day. As part of construction, dust mitigation measures, including water trucks, will be utilized on all access roads.

Per Section 2-02-08-01 of the Development Standards, the purpose of a conditional use permit is to ensure that a proposed use conditionally permitted in a zone district will be compatible with the surrounding area, as well as character of the neighborhood, and not detrimental to the health, safety, or welfare of inhabitants of the surrounding area. The intensity of the use and associated operations makes such an industrial use generally incompatible with residential developments. However, the surrounding area consists of large tracts of agricultural land or single-family residential development on parcels of 35 acres or greater. The nearest occupied dwellings are approximately one-quarter of a mile from the proposed compressor station. According to the applicant, the subject site was chosen due to the low-density residential character around the vicinity of the property. In addition, per Section 3-10-07-05 of the County's development standards, the maximum height permitted in the A-3 zone district is 70 feet. The proposed development includes 65-foot tall venting towers which conform to the allowed height in the A-3 zone district.

The proposed conditional use will be compatible with the surrounding area, and not be detrimental to the health, safety, and welfare of the inhabitants of the area. The compressor

station facility will be designed to mitigate potential nuisances. In addition, staff is recommending conditions of approval to address site operations, dust control, site appearance, hours of operations, and setbacks for all equipment.

Future Land Use Designation/Comprehensive Plan:

The property is designated as Agriculture in the County's future land use map. Per Chapter 5 of the Adams County Comprehensive Plan, Agriculture areas are not expected to develop, except for very low density residential at 1 dwelling per 35 acres.

All of the surrounding properties to the site are also designated as Agriculture future land use. A majority of the surrounding properties to the west are developed with single-family residential uses. The properties to the north, south, and east are used for agriculture.

The request conforms to the goals of the Comprehensive Plan, as this area is not intended to be developed with additional residential uses. In addition, the Airport Height and Noise Overlays restrict future development of occupied buildings near the airport. This limitation is due to potential nuisance conditions created by noise generated from aviation activities.

Compatibility with the Surrounding Land Uses:

A majority of the surrounding properties to the north, south, east, and west of the subject property are developed as large-lot, rural single-family residential (35 acres or greater) or agricultural. The property directly to the north is undeveloped, except for one accessory structure (barn) and a personal equestrian arena. The nearest residential dwelling is approximately 1,033 feet to the north of the proposed compressor station. There is a residential dwelling located approximately 1,521 feet to the south of the proposed station, on the east side of Powhaton Road. In addition, there are three residential dwellings located more than 4,000 feet to the west of the proposed station area.

In addition to residential and agricultural development, the surrounding area is developed with several major energy facilities, including two natural gas compressor stations (i.e. Brighton Station which is located two miles south of the subject site and Tri-State Brighton Generation which is also located one mile south of the subject site). Xcel Energy owns and operates a utility substation (i.e. the Barr Lake Substation) which is located one mile south of the subject site and

includes125-foot tall electric transmission towers and lines which travel north along Powhaton Road.

From the application documents, the proposed development is necessary to support oil and natural gas development in this area of the County, including anticipated wellpads and existing underground pipelines. In addition, according to the applicant, the site is designed to accommodate additional compressors in anticipation of future volume and demand for natural gas. The site will be designed to mitigate potential noise, odor, and light pollution that may be associated with the project. Further, the site will be surrounded by ornamental fencing and landscaping to provide visual aesthetics and security.

Planning Commission Update:

The Planning Commission (PC) considered this case on April 12, 2018 and recommended unanimous approval (7-0) of the request. At the hearing, the PC asked the applicant to further describe various components of the proposed compressor station, how the station functions in relation to the Boardwalk Pipeline, and when Phase Two of the development is expected to be constructed. The applicant explained how compressor stations boost the volume of natural gas in a pipeline and allow the gas to travel from a production site, such as a wellpad, to the final destination, such as a refinery plant. The applicant also informed the PC that the Boardwalk pipeline transports product from the southern part of the county to Weld County where several refinery plants are located. The applicant stated the proposed compressor station is designed to operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and will be inspected on a daily basis to ensure all equipment is properly functioning and maintained. Phase Two of the facility is expected to be developed within the next two years, which will be based on the volume and demand for natural gas. Phase Two will contain the same number and type of equipment as shown on the Phase One site plan.

The applicant informed the PC that each of the four compressors will be contained in an enclosed, insulated building to provide noise mitigation. The buildings are approximately thirty feet tall while the venting towers, used to dehydrate and burn off excess gas, are approximately sixty-five feet tall. In addition, the applicant informed the PC that burning off excess gas (flaring) will be very rare and only necessary during emergencies or specific maintenance of the equipment.

The PC asked the applicant to provide details on the proposed visual screening plan associated with the request. The applicant stated that the ten acre lease area will be surrounded by a decorative eight-foot wall with landscape installed along the outside of the wall. Staff has reviewed the proposed landscape plan and determined the plan complies with Section 4-16 of the County's Development Standards and Regulations. The PC also asked the applicant if the property owner has any plans to develop the remainder of the 35 acre parcel. According to the applicant, the property owner does not have any plans to develop the property in the immediate future. In addition, the aviation noise and height overlays restrict certain types of development on the property, including occupied buildings. There were no members of the public present to speak in support or opposition.

Referral Comments:

Xcel Energy, the Federal Aviation Administration, Brighton Fire Rescue District, and Tri-County Health Department reviewed the request and had no concerns. Tri-County Health provided the applicant with best management practices for above ground fuel storage, traffic control, and a mosquito control plan for the proposed on-site drainage facility.

PC and Staff Recommendations:

Based upon the application, the criteria for approval of a conditional use permit, and a recent site visit, the PC and staff recommend Approval of this request with 8 findings-of-fact, 4 conditions precedent, 16 conditions, and 1 note:

RECOMMENDED FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The conditional use is permitted in the applicable zone district.
- 2. The conditional use is consistent with the purposes of these standards and regulations.
- 3. The conditional use will comply with the requirements of these standards and regulations including, but not limited to, all applicable performance standards.
- 4. The conditional use is compatible with the surrounding area, harmonious with the character of the neighborhood, not detrimental to the immediate area, not detrimental to the future development of the area, and not detrimental to the health, safety, or welfare of the inhabitants of the area and the County.
- 5. The conditional use permit has addressed all off-site impacts.
- 6. The site is suitable for the conditional use including adequate usable space, adequate access, and absence of environmental constraints.
- 7. The site plan for the proposed conditional use will provide the most convenient and functional use of the lot including the parking scheme, traffic circulation, open space, fencing, screening, landscaping, signage, and lighting.
- 8. Sewer, water, storm water drainage, fire protection, police protection, and roads are to be available and adequate to serve the needs of the conditional use as designed and proposed.

Recommended Conditions Precedent:

1. The applicant shall submit copies of all applicable state and federal permits for the compressor station to the Community and Economic Development Department no later than 60 days after the Board of County Commissioners hearing date.

- 2. The applicant shall submit emergency contact information, emergency response plans, and final as-built plans for the site to the local fire district, Adams County Community and Economic Development, and the Adams County Emergency management within two months of building permit issuance and prior to commencing operations.
- 3. Prior to site disturbance and commencing construction activities, the applicant shall apply for all necessary construction and building permits, including oversize load, stormwater management, and fence permits.
- 4. The applicant shall prepare and submit a Traffic Control Plan describing any impacts to the County's right-of-way during the construction period, including but not limited to, lane closures, access to construction staging sites, and hours of operation. The traffic control plan shall address how impacts to adjacent property owners shall be minimized during the construction period. The applicant shall obtain written approval of the traffic control plan from the Community and Economic Development Department prior to commencing any construction.

Recommended Conditions of Approval:

- 1. This conditional use permit shall expire on May 1, 2028, unless a renewal is obtained from the Board of County Commissioners prior to the expiration date.
- 2. During construction activities, the applicant shall adhere to all required stormwater management plans and best management practices to capture and treat all onsite stormwater runoff.
- 3. The applicant is responsible for the cleanliness and safety of all adjacent roadways (Powhaton Rd.) to the site. If at any time, these roadways are found to be dangerous or impassable due to debris or mud caused by construction activities associated with the compressor station, the applicant shall cease all operations immediately and clear the roadway. Operations shall not resume until the County, at its sole discretion, deems the roadway conditions are acceptable. If the applicant fails to adequately maintain roadways adjacent to the site, the Public Works Department has the option to perform any required clean up and bill the charges directly to the applicant.
- 4. The applicant is responsible for repairing County right-of-way that is damaged as a result of the construction operations. Repairs shall occur as soon as possible, but no later, than six (6) months following construction completion, unless an extension is granted by the County for extenuating circumstances. The applicant may submit evidence of the condition of the County's right-of-way at the start and completion of construction in order to determine pre and post-construction condition of the roadways.
- 5. Hours of operation for on-site maintenance or inspections are limited to 8:00 am to 4:00 pm Monday through Sunday, except during emergency situations that would cause the applicant to be out of compliance with any applicable local, state, or federal regulations. The Director of Community and Economic Development may extend the hours of operation if there is a demonstrated need, provided in writing from the applicant.
- 6. All fluid spills, such as hydraulic and oil from maintenance of equipment, shall be removed and disposed of at a facility permitted for such disposal. All fuel storage areas shall have a secondary containment and a routine monitoring system to check for leaks.
- 7. Venting flares are limited to the hours of operation (8:00 am to 4:00 pm) unless during an emergency situation.

- 8. The site shall comply with noise standards outlined in Section 4-13-03 of the County's development standards and regulations.
- 9. All above ground infrastructure shall comply with the minimum property line setbacks required in the A-3 zone district.
- 10. The maximum height for all infrastructure associated with the project, including wireless communications towers, shall be 65-feet, as shown on the approved site plans.
- 11. The applicant shall install all landscape and screening as shown on the approved plan submitted with the application. These improvements shall be installed and inspected prior to final inspection for any building permits. The screen fencing shall be compatible in color to the surrounding area, including tan or green color schemes.
- 12. Fugitive dust control mechanisms must be in place and functioning at all times and shall include dust mitigation on the access road.
- 13. Lighting shall be arranged and positioned so no direct lighting or reflection of lighting creates a nuisance or hazard to any adjoining property or right-of-way.
- 14. An updated landscape and screening plan is required prior to installation of any "Phase Two" equipment as indicated on the approved site plan. All landscape and screen fencing shall be installed and inspected prior to final inspections for any building permit associated with Phase Two.
- 15. All complaints received by the applicant concerning nuisance conditions attributable to the operation, and the resolution of those complaints, shall be conveyed to the Department of Community and Economic Development. Impacts from nuisance conditions from the operation shall be responded to and resolved immediately (at most within 24 hours for non-emergency issues) by the applicant. Disputes concerning nuisance conditions from the operation may be resolved by the Department of Community and Economic and may be justification for a Show Cause Hearing before the Adams County Board of County Commissioners.
- 16. Violations to the conditions of approval may result in a show cause hearing before the Board of County Commissioners to revoke or suspend the conditional use permit.

Notes to the Applicant:

1. All applicable building, zoning, health, engineering, and fire codes shall be adhered to with this request.

Notices were sent to all property owners within a half-mile radius of the site. One person commented on the request expressing concerns about potential noise and visual impacts of the compressor station to the surrounding neighborhood. As described in the report and on the application documents, the equipment area and proposed infrastructure will be installed approximately 360 feet from the eastern property line adjacent to Powhaton Road. Of the 10 acre lease area, only 2.5 acres of the site will contain equipment and the perimeter of the lease area will be surrounded by ornamental screen fencing and landscape installed to provide a buffer between adjacent land uses. The compressor station will generate minimal traffic after the initial construction period. Staff is recommending conditions of approval to address site operations, dust control, site appearance, hours of operations, and setbacks for all equipment.

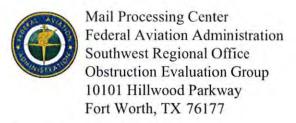
Below is a project explanation to accompany the Conditional Use Permit (CUP) application for the Powhaton Compressor Station proposed at 14501 Powhaton Road.

- Discovery DJ Services intends to construct a compressor station with the following equipment: The station will include 4 compressors, a slug catcher, metering, dehydration, a process flare and a process vent flare, MCC building, fuel gas small tanks and a pump skid. The compressors will be inside of arctic type structures.
- 2. The compressor site will be on a 10 acre leased parcel, of which 2.5 acres will be disturbed.
- 3. The compressor station is an un-manned facility. The hours of operation will typically be Monday through Sunday 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.
- 4. The site will require one or two truck trips per week and 1 part-time operator stopping at the site once a day.
- Traffic will access the sites from Powhaton Road through an existing driveway.
- 6. No storage or warehousing is planned for the site.

This memorandum provides trip generation estimates for the proposed Powhatton Compressor Station at 14501 Powhatton Road in Adams County. The site location is shown on the aerial photograph in the Appendix. The site plan is also provided in the Appendix. This memorandum addresses the expected trip generation during construction of the compressor station and after the compressor station is operating on a daily basis. The customary document used to provide these estimates is Trip Generation, 10th Edition, ITE. However, neither construction of this facility or the day-to-day operation is contained in the cited document. Therefore the owner/operator was contacted to develop the trip generation.

It is estimated that the construction phase of the compressor station will last approximately two months. Construction will occur seven days per week. The typical construction day will be 5:30 am to 7:00 pm. During the first two weeks, all/most of the equipment/materials will be delivered to the site. Semi-trucks will be used for these deliveries. On a high/normal day, there could be 50 semi-trucks arriving/departing the site over the course of a 13-hour day. It is assumed that the deliveries would be on a steady basis or 8 trip ends in any given hour (4 - in, 4 - out). There would be approximately 50 workers on the site during the construction phase, using private vehicles (pick-up trucks). They would arrive at the beginning of the work day and depart at the end of the work day. It is expected that some of the workers would come/go in the course of the day for various reasons. The estimate is two per hour, on a steady basis, over the course of a 13-hour day. The trip generation estimate for the initial two weeks of the construction phase is shown in Table 1. The average trip generation will be: 250 daily trip ends, 60 morning peak hour trip ends, and 60 evening peak hour trip ends. The peaks hours shown depict the beginning and end of the work day. It is expected that primary (75 percent) of the construction vehicles will be from/to 120th Avenue, with the remainder (25 percent) from/to 152nd Avenue.

During the remaining portion of the construction phase (approximately six weeks), only the workers will be at the site. The work day will remain the same. It is assumed that all of the equipment/materials are at the site during this time. The trip generation for this portion of the construction phase is shown in Table 2. The average trip generation will be: 150 daily trip ends, 52 morning peak hour trip ends, and 52 evening peak hour trip ends.

Once the site is built and operating, there will be limited activity at the site on a daily basis. An operator would visit the site for a portion of each day. This may or may not occur during the typical peak hours of the street. There may also be one or two other site visits per week. Table 3 shows the trip generation estimate once the site is operating.

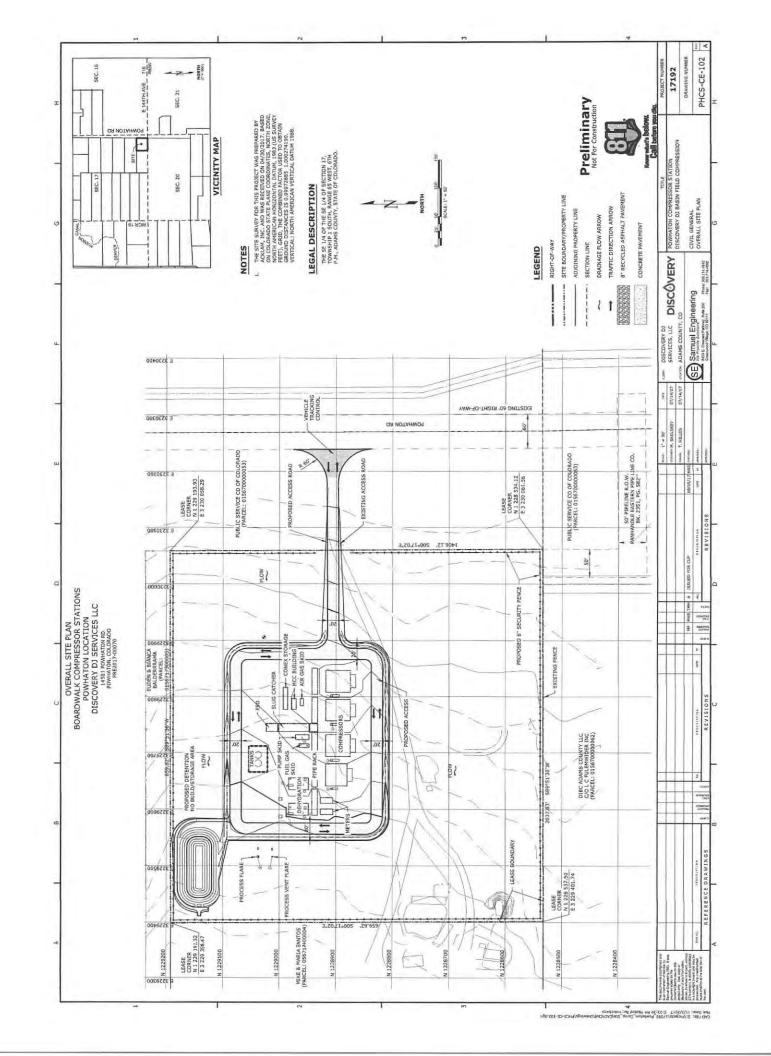
It is concluded that most of the trip activity at the Powhatton Compressor Station will occur during the construction phase. ENG1: The Level 3 Storm Drainage Study was not signed and stamped by a professional engineer registered within the state of Colorado.

ENG2: The drainage plans show retention ponds as the proposed drainage facility for the site. Adams County Development Engineering will need the following documentation from the applicant before retention ponds can be approved:

1. The use of retention ponds will require verification and description of the type of water rights owned by the developer.

2. The state of Colorado will also rquire the review and approval of an augmentation plan from the developer before retention ponds are allowed to be constructed.

ENG3: The other option to consider is design the ponds as a "Detention Pond through infiltration." To do this the applicant must be the following requirement as described in Senate bill 15-212, which requires that a storm water pond release OR infiltrate the 5 year storm in 72 hours or less and storms greater than the 5 year storm in 120 hours or less.

ENG4: The drawings shall indicate any proposed phasing of construction. If off- site fill material is required to support the grading plan, the fill source and quantity are required to be indicated on the drawings and it shall include the source and quantity of selected off-site material.

ENG5: All drainage easements and maintenance access points shall be identified on plans. The submittal shall include a copy of the final plat to verify easements.

ENG6: An operation and maintenance manual for the drainage facilities is required to be submitted to Adams County. This plan should be recorded with the Clerk and Recorder Office and the recorded document number shall be identified on the plat.

Thank you for the opportunity to review and comment on the Conditional Use Permit for the Powhaton Compressor Station located at 14501 Powhaton Road. Tri-County Health Department (TCHD) staff has reviewed the application for compliance with applicable environmental and public health regulations and principles of healthy community design. After reviewing the application, TCHD has the following comments.

Air Quality Permitting

Air pollutant emissions including flares are regulated by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment. Vapor recovery equipment should be used to control the release of vapors into the environment. The use of green completion technology is strongly encouraged at every site. If the site is to use multiple flares and combustors, the oil and gas industry permits should include a regulatory analysis determining the applicability of state and federal air quality permitting requirements and air pollution control regulations for the proposed emissions source(s). More information as well as all forms can be found online at https://www.colorado.gov/pacific/cdphe/all-permits.

Above Ground Storage Tanks

Fuel is often stored onsite at oil and gas sites. All storage tanks must have a secondary containment area, a routine monitoring system to check for leaks, and best management practices implemented in order to prevent the release of contaminants into the soil and water supplies.

Traffic Safety

Oil and gas production and monitoring wells involve significant truck traffic to and from a site during the construction and drilling process. TCHD commends the applicant for including traffic control in their best management practices and TCHD encourages the County to designate a primary traffic route for all construction traffic and deliveries. If the trucks servicing the site will be traveling on a local school bus route, we encourage the County to work with the applicant to minimize traffic during hours when school buses are in operation.

Mosquito Control - Stormwater Facilities

The site plan indicates that a detention pond is proposed. Detention ponds can become sites for mosquito breeding. To reduce the potential for human exposures to West Nile and other mosquito-borne viruses, TCHD recommends that the applicant prepare a mosquito control plan. Elements of the plan should include proper design, construction and regular inspection and maintenance of stormwater quality facilities, and mosquito larvaciding if the insects become a problem. The applicant may submit the mosquito control plan to TCHD for review. More information is available here http://www.tchd.org/276/Mosquitoes-West-Nile-Virus. A guidance document is attached.

Tri-County Health Department Guidance for Preparation of Mosquito Control Plan

A Mosquito Control Plan should contain the following elements:

1. Designation of a management entity

This is the entity with authority/responsibility for implementing the plan. Typically, this will be a Special District or a Homeowners Association. If this is the case, the applicant shall submit a copy of the organizational Service Plan, by-laws or other legal document providing the authority for mosquito control. If the entity is the developer, this should be noted.

2. Funding mechanism

A method needs to be put in place to finance the program. This could be a commitment for the Service District, HOA or developer to include adequate funds for the activities as part of its annual budgeting process, or a plan by the District or HOA to assess an annual fee on residents in the subject service area, or to fund the program in some other way, per its legal authority as noted in #1.

3. Activities that will be undertaken to prevent mosquito breeding conditions

This section places emphasis on the proper design, construction, operation and maintenance of stormwater facilities to prevent mosquitoes from breeding. In most instances, it is nothing different than is already required by the County and Volume 3 of the Urban Drainage and Flood Control District's (UDFCD) Urban Storm Drainage Criteria Manual for flood control and stormwater quality. The literature on this subject, supported by local field experience, suggests that if stormwater facilities are well-designed, built to specification, and regularly inspected and maintained to meet operating standards, stormwater facilities that are designed to completely drain in 72 hours or less are likely to do so and to prevent mosquito breeding conditions.

The likelihood or extent of mosquito breeding can also be reduced through the proper design, construction and inspection/maintenance of retention ponds or constructed wetlands that are intended to hold permanent water pools.

We have found that at the time of construction of stormwater facilities, there is often little thought given to continuity of maintenance. Requiring the applicant to think through the tasks that need to be accomplished from design through operation, who will be responsible for tasks in each phase, and a schedule for their accomplishment increases the probability that these tasks will be completed.

Ideally, before getting to this point, the applicant will have considered stormwater facility options that do not rely on extended retention or detention of stormwater without flushing over a period of 2-3 days; e.g. grass swales, porous pavements, landscape detention, reducing directly connecting impervious areas to increase infiltration. This would be coordinated through and in compliance with the requirements of the County's Engineering and/or Stormwater sections.

Suggested elements in this section include the following:

 Design review – Qualified personnel review construction plans and conduct field investigation to ensure construction per specifications of UDFCD Volume 3 and County criteria.

Operation and maintenance activities:

This should identify who will conduct these activities (e.g., staff or contractor), and a schedule or trigger point for doing each task. Again, the UDFCD's Vol. 3 contains minimum operation and maintenance activities. If staff are to be used, this section should note if they will need training and how they will receive it.

Regular inspections:

Facilities that are found to retain water should be inspected regularly to ensure that no mosquito larvae are present. Facilities should be inspected once a week beginning in April and continuing through September.

Larvacide program:

Even if inspections do not reveal larvae, a larvaciding program should be established as a preventive measure at the same time that the inspection program begins (generally May) and continue through September. Some mosquitoes lay their eggs in mud, and when rain falls later, they can hatch and present a problem. Larvacide should be applied at the recommended rate and frequency specified by the product manufacturer. Mosquito control products can be found by doing a search on the internet.

Natural control of mosquito larva can be very effective is done properly. Consult the Colorado Department of Wildlife, Fisheries Division, for consultation on proper stocking of ponds with fish that will effectively control mosquito larvae.

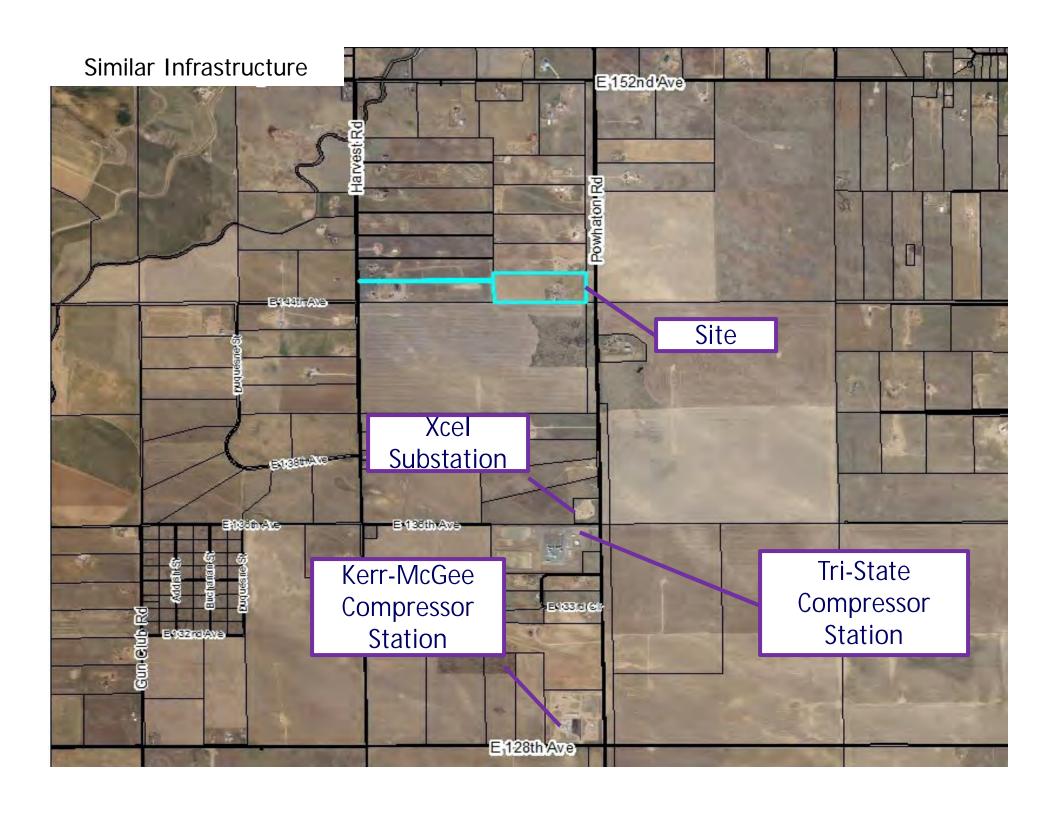


Concrete Wall Perimeter

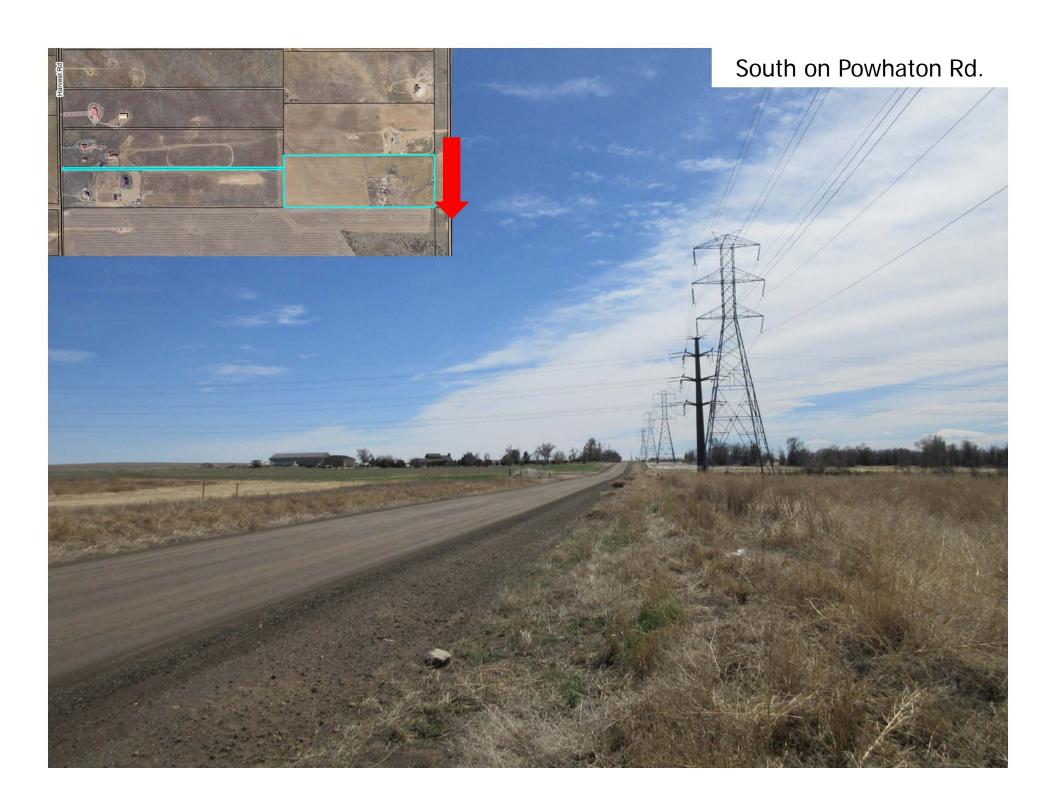




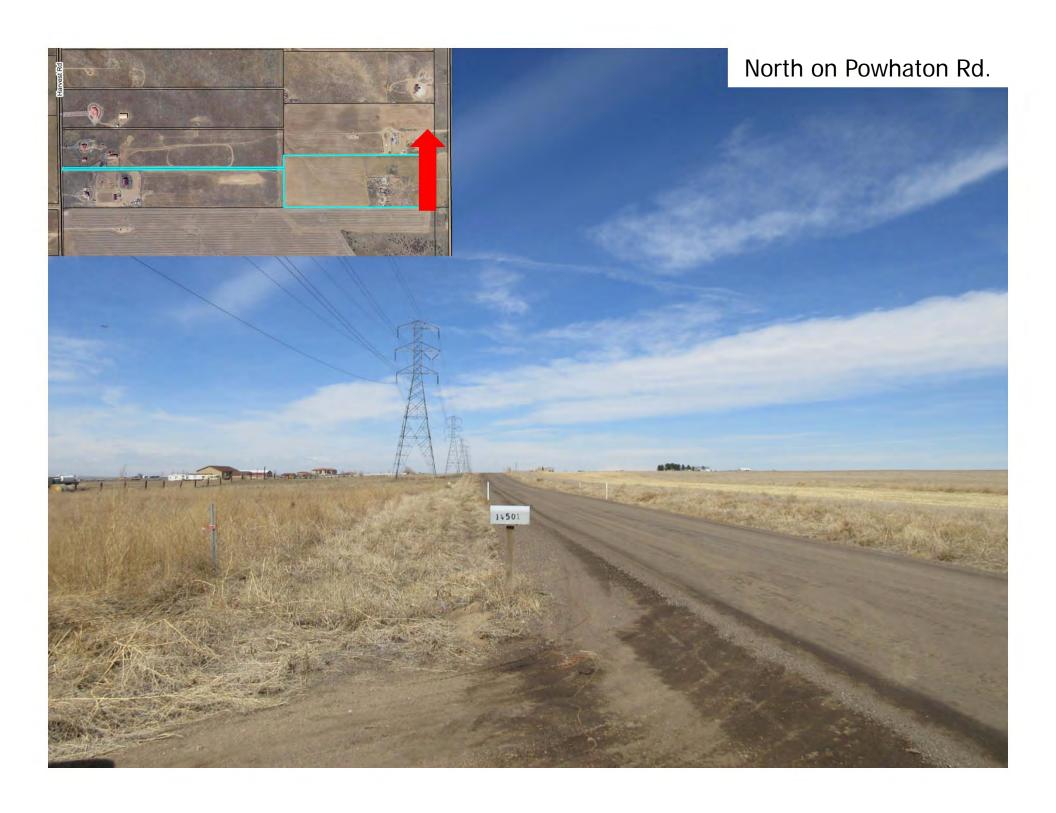

- 2. The applicant shall submit emergency contact information, emergency response plans, and final as-built plans for the site to the local fire district, Adams County Community and Economic Development, and Adams County Emergency management prior to submittal of any construction permits.
- 3. Prior to site disturbance and commencing construction activities, the applicant shall apply for all necessary construction and building permits, including oversize load, stormwater management, and fence permits.
- 4. The applicant shall prepare and submit a Traffic Control Plan describing any impacts to the County's right-of-way during the construction period, including but not limited to, lane closures, access to construction staging sites, and hours of operation. The traffic control plan shall be prepared in a way to minimize impacts to adjacent property owners during the construction period. The applicant shall obtain written approval of the traffic control plan from the Community and Economic Development Department prior to commencing any construction.

- 1. This conditional use permit shall expire on May 1, 2028, unless a renewal is obtained from the Board of County Commissioners prior to the expiration date.
- 2. During construction activities, the applicant shall adhere to all required stormwater management plans and best management practices to capture and treat all onsite stormwater runoff.
- 3. The applicant is responsible for the cleanliness and safety of all adjacent roadways (Powhaton Rd.) to the site. If at any time, these roadways are found to be dangerous or impassable due to debris or mud caused by construction activities associated with the compressor station, the applicant shall cease all operations immediately and clear the roadway. Operations shall not resume until the County, at its sole discretion, deems the roadway conditions are acceptable. If the applicant fails to maintenance clear roadways adjacent to the site, the Public Works Department has the option to do the required clean up and bill the charges directly to the applicant.
- 4. The applicant is responsible for repairing County right-of-way that is damaged as a result of the construction operations. Repairs shall occur as soon as possible, but no later, than six (6) months following construction completion, unless an extension is granted by the County for extenuating circumstances. The applicant may submit evidence of the condition of the County's right-of-way at the start and completion of construction in order to discern pre and post-construction condition of the roadways.

- 5. Hours of operation for on-site maintenance or inspections are limited to 8:00 am to 4:00 pm Monday through Sunday, except during emergency situations that would cause the applicant to be out of compliance with any applicable local, state, or federal regulations. The Director of Community and Economic Development may extend the hours of operation if there is a demonstrated need, provided in writing from the applicant.
- 6. All fluid spills, such as hydraulic and oil from maintenance of equipment, shall be removed and disposed of at a facility permitted for such disposal. All fuel storage areas shall have a secondary containment and a routine monitoring system to check for leaks.
- 7. Venting flares are limited to the hours of operation (8:00 am to 4:00 pm) unless during an emergency situation.
- 8. The site shall comply with noise standards outlined in Section 4-13-03 of the County's development standards and regulations.
- 9. All above ground infrastructure shall comply with the minimum property line setbacks required in the A-3 zone district.
- 10. The maximum height for all infrastructure associated with the project, including wireless communications towers, shall be 65-feet, as shown on the approved site plans.
- 11. The applicant shall install all landscape and screening as shown on the approved plan submitted with the application. These improvements shall be installed and inspected prior to final inspection for any building permits. The screen fencing shall be compatible in color to the surrounding area, including tan or green color schemes.
- 12. Fugitive dust control mechanisms must be in place and functioning at all times and shall include dust mitigation on the access road.

- 13. Lighting shall be arranged and positioned so no direct lighting or reflection of lighting creates a nuisance or hazard to any adjoining property or right-of-way.
- 14. An updated landscape and screening plan is required prior to installation of any "Phase Two" equipment as indicated on the approved site plan. All landscape and screen fencing shall be installed and inspected prior to final inspections for any building permit associated with Phase Two.
- 15. All complaints received by the applicant concerning nuisance conditions attributable to the operation, and the resolution of those complaints, shall be conveyed to the Department of Community and Economic Development. Impacts from nuisance conditions from the operation shall be responded to and resolved immediately (at most within 24 hours for non-emergency issues) by the applicant. Disputes concerning nuisance conditions from the operation may be resolved by the Department of Community and Economic and may be justification for a Show Cause Hearing before the Adams County Board of County Commissioners.
- 16. Violations to the conditions of approval may result in a show cause hearing before the Board of County Commissioners to revoke or suspend the conditional use permit.
