RECOMMENDED ACTION: That the Board of County Commissioners Approves the grant award funds to projects as recommended by the Open Space Advisory Board.

BACKGROUND:

On February 1, 2018, the Open Space Program received eighteen grant applications, including seven passive grant applications, eight active grant applications, and three mini-grant applications. The total amount requested was \$6,047,782.50, which included \$3,084,646 for passive projects, \$2,949,436.50 for active projects, and \$13,700 for mini-grants. The total amount available for distribution was \$6,832,096.43.

The Open Space Advisory Board (OSAB) recommended full funding of all of the three mini-grant applications, full funding for all seven passive applications and five active applications, partial funding for two active applications, and zero funding for one active application. If the Board of County Commissioners follows the OSAB's recommendations, the fund will carry a balance of \$1,749,605.93 to the next grant cycle. The recommended funding will increase the level of overall active funding from 28% to 28.04%.

BACKGROUND:

The applicant is requesting an amendment to a previously approved Subdivision Improvement Agreement for the Cavanaugh Hills Phase 3 Subdivision. On October 18, 2004, the Board of County Commissioners (BoCC) approved the Cavanaugh Hills Subdivision, which included eighty-four single-family residential lots, public streets, and open space areas. As part of the Subdivision approval, the BoCC also approved a Subdivision Improvement Agreement for construction of public improvements associated with the plat.

The purpose of the proposed amended Subdivision Improvement Agreement is to include current required improvements resulting from the addition of new right-of-way to allow for the development of twenty lots and construction of Manila Road to current County standards. The improvements also include storm drainage and roadway signage. The BoCC approved additional right-of-way dedication for Manilla Road on May 1, 2018 (RWC2018-00005) to accommodate the required public improvements for the twenty lots.

The subject request is consistent with the requirement for approval for SIAs. Staff reviewed the SIA and determined the documents conform to the requirements outlined in Section 5-02-05 of the County's Development Standard and Regulations. Currently, staff is reviewing construction plans associated with the SIA. However, final approval of the construction documents is contingent upon a satisfactory review and an approval of the SIA.

As a requirement of the Subdivision Improvements Agreement, the Developer has furnished a Letter of Credit to guarantee compliance with the SIA. Said Letter of Credit is in the amount of six hundred fifty seven thousand four hundred eighty six dollars and no cents (\$657,486.00).

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RESOLUTION APPROVING A SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENTS AGREEMENT BETWEEN RLJ DEVELOPMENT, LLC, AND ADAMS COUNTY FOR SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, the Development Standards and Regulations of the County of Adams, State of Colorado, require a developer to enter into a Development Agreement for the construction of certain public and private improvements; and,

WHEREAS, RLJ Development, LLC, is the owner of certain real property known as Cavanaugh Hills, Phase 3, Case No. PLN2018-00009; and,

WHEREAS, the County and the Developer desire to enter into a Subdivision Improvements Agreement for the improvements at the Cavanaugh Hills, Phase 3 parcels; and,

WHEREAS, the Adams County Public Works Department and the Community and Economic Development Department recommend approval of the attached Subdivision Improvements Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the Subdivision Improvements Agreement between RLJ Development, LLC, and Adams County, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, be approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chair of the Board of County Commissioners be authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of the County of Adams, State of Colorado.

SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENTS AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the County of Adams, State of Colorado, hereinafter called "County," and RLJ Development, LLC, 38821 E. 145th Ave., Keenesburg, CO 80643, hereinafter called "Developer."

THIS proposed "Subdivision Improvements Agreement" is intended to amend a previous SIA between Adams County and Ute South, LLC, Case No. PRJ2004-00026. There is no found record of a previous agreement having been recorded.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Developer is the owner of real property in the County of Adams, State of Colorado, as described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, and by this reference made a part hereof.

WHEREAS, it is provided by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, that where designated the Developer shall have entered into a written agreement with the County to install public and/or private improvements, and to deed land for public purposes or right-of-way.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the parties hereto promise, covenant, and agree as follows:

- 1. **Engineering Services**. Developer shall furnish, at its own expense, all engineering and other services in connection with the design and construction of the improvements described and detailed on Exhibit "B" attached hereto, and by this reference made a part hereof.
- 2. **Drawings and Estimates**. The Developer shall furnish drawings and cost estimates for all improvements described and detailed on Exhibit "B" for approval by the County. Upon request, the Developer shall furnish one set of reproducible "as built" drawings and a final statement of construction costs to the County.
- 3. **Construction**. Developer shall furnish and construct, at its own expense and in accordance with drawings and materials approved by the County, the improvements described and detailed on Exhibit "B".
- 4. **Time for Completion**. Improvements shall be completed according to the terms of this agreement within "construction completion date" appearing in Exhibit "B". The Director of Community and Economic Development Department may for good cause grant extension of time for completion of any part or all of improvements appearing on said Exhibit "B". Any extension greater than 180 days is within the sole discretion of the Board of County Commissioners. All extensions of time must be in writing.
- 5. Guarantee of Compliance. Developer shall furnish to the County a cash escrow deposit or other acceptable collateral, releasable only by the County, to guarantee compliance with this agreement. Said collateral shall be in the amount of \$657,485.64_including twenty percent (20%) to cover administration and five percent (5%) per year for the term of the Agreement to cover inflation. Upon approval of the final plat, completion of said improvements constructed according to the terms of this agreement, and preliminary acceptance by the Director of Public Works in accordance with section 5-02-05-01 of the County's Development Standards and Regulations, the collateral shall be released. Completion of said improvements shall be determined solely by the County, and a reasonable part of said collateral, up to 20%, may be retained to guarantee maintenance of public improvements for a period of one year from the date of completion.

No construction or building permits shall be issued until said collateral is furnished in the amount required and in a form acceptable to the Board of County Commissioners and until the final plat has been approved and the improvements described in Exhibit "B" have been preliminarily accepted by the Department of Public Works.

6. Acceptance and Maintenance of Public Improvements. All improvements designated "public" on Exhibit "B" shall be public facilities and become the property of the County or

other public agencies upon acceptance. During the period of one year from and after the acceptance of public improvements, the Developer shall, at its own expense, make all needed repairs or replacement due to defective materials or workmanship which, in the opinion of the County, becomes necessary. If, within ten days of written notice to the Developer from the County requesting such repairs or replacements, the Developer has not undertaken with due diligence to make the same, the County may make such repairs or replacements at the Developer's expense. In the case of an emergency such written notice may be waived.

- 7. **Successors and Assigns**. This agreement shall be binding upon the heirs, executors, personal representatives, successors, and assigns of the Developer, and shall be deemed a covenant running with the real property as described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.
- 8. **Improvements and Dedication**. The undersigned Developer hereby agrees to provide the following improvements, and to dedicate described property.

A. Improvements.

Public Improvements:

Construction of Roadway Improvements at East 144th Avenue and Manilla Road, construction of the Internal Roadway System and Storm Drainage Improvements. See Exhibit "B" for description, estimated quantities and estimated construction costs.

The improvements shall be constructed in accordance with all County requirements and specifications in accordance with the approved plans and time schedule as indicated in Exhibit "B".

B. **Public dedication of land for right-of-way purposes or other public purpose**. Upon approval of this agreement by the Board of County Commissioners, the Developer hereby agrees to convey by warranty deed to the County of Adams the following described land for right-of-way or other public purposes:

In Cavanaugh Hills Phase 3, Block 9, Lots 1, 5, 6, 11, 12, 17 & 18, there is an additional 20ft of Right-of Way along the west side of Manilla Rd. being dedicated by separate instrument.

WHEREAS, in exchange for such defense, the Defendants are required to cooperate fully in the defense of this matter, including but not limited to, assisting in the discovery process, participating in mediation, facilitation, or other measures deemed appropriate by the Board of County Commissioners, and Defendants acknowledge that Adams County may settle on behalf of the Defendants any or all asserted claims, including those for personal liability and punitive damages.

Sections 676B of the Community Services Block Grant Reauthorization Act of 1998 requires that, as a condition of designation, private nonprofit entities and public organizations administer their CSBG program through tripartite boards that "fully participate in the development, planning, implementation, and evaluation of the program to serve low-income communities."

On March 9, 2018, the CSBGAC (Adams County tri-partite board) reviewed the bylaws and made recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners.

WHEREAS, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) allocates Community Services Block Grant funds to the State of Colorado, Department of Local Affairs through an annual formula allocation; and,

WHEREAS, Section 676B of the Community Service Block Grant Reauthorization Act requires that public organizations administer their CSBG program through tripartite boards; and,

WHEREAS, the Adams County Community Services Block Grant Advisory Council (Advisory Council) has been established to perform that function and participate in the development, planning, implementation, and evaluation of the County's CSBG program; and,

WHEREAS, the Advisory Council held a meeting on March 9, 2018, to review and recommend the proposed Bylaws to the Board of County Commissioners; and,

WHEREAS, the Advisory Council recommends approval of the attached Bylaws to include other manners of voting, an attendance policy, and other minor changes to ensure clarity.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, and State of Colorado, that the Adams County Community Services Block Grant Advisory Council Bylaws be approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chair is authorized to execute said Bylaws on behalf of Adams County.

BYLAWS Revised TBD

1.00 ARTICLE I – NAME AND PURPOSE

1.01 Name of the Advisory Council

The name of the Council shall be the Adams County Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) Advisory Council (CSBGAC).

1.02 Purpose of the Advisory Council

The primary purpose of the CSBGAC is to advise the Adams County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) concerning the administration of the Community Services Block Grant program, pursuant to the Community Services Block Grant Act, Pub. Law 105-285, § 676B, 42 U.S.C. 9910, as amended. In addition, the CSBGAC may:

- (a) Make funding recommendations concerning Community Services Block Grants to the Human Services (HS) Department, and the Board of County Commissioners (BOCC);
- (b) Encourage citizen participation in all phases of the grant's process;
- (c) Assist in obtaining and communicating information and feedback from targeted populations concerning the effectiveness of services and programs provided by the CSBG Program;
- (d) Review applications and make funding recommendations for the CSBG Program to the Adams County Board of County Commissioners;
- (e) Assist in identifying additional funding resources for use by the CSBG Program and/or its implementing partners;
- (f) At the request of HS, assist in providing feedback in the development of results-oriented strategies.

1.03 Purpose of the Bylaws

The purpose of these Bylaws shall be to establish the organizational rules and responsibilities of the Adams County Community Services Block Grant Advisory Council (CSBGAC) and its relationship with the Human Services Department, and the Adams County Board of County Commissioners.

2.00 ARTICLE II – APPOINTMENTS, ELECTIONS, AND TERM OF OFFICE

2.01 Tripartite Board Composition Requirements

The CSBGAC shall consist of a tripartite structure pursuant to the Community Services Block Grant Act, § 676B(b), 42 U.S.C. § 9910. All members of the CSBGAC shall reside in Adams County or work for an agency that provides services in Adams County. In addition, CSBGAC members will be appointed by the BOCC in accordance with democratic selection procedures to assure:

- (a) One-third (1/3) shall be comprised of elected public officials or their representatives;
- (b) Not fewer than one-third (1/3) shall be representatives of low-income individuals and families in the communities served:
- (c) The remainder shall be private sector representatives from business, industry, labor, and other groups of interests in the community.

2.02 Appointments

The BOCC shall appoint the members of the CSBGAC. Such appointments may be based on recommendations made by the Human Services Department Director, HS Program Manager, and/or any other sources the BOCC deems appropriate.

2.03 Number of Advisory Council Members

The BOCC has determined that the number of members shall be comprised of at least five (5) members and not more than nine (9) members.

2.05 Election of Officers

The CSBGAC shall elect officers yearly during the annual meeting in first quarter of the calendar year. Nominations from the floor will be accepted.

2.06 Term of Office

The term of office for CSBGAC members shall be three (3) years. At the end of the first term of appointment, members may be reappointed to serve for one (1) additional three (3)-year term at the sole discretion of the BOCC. If a member leaves the position, Adams County CSBG staff will work with BOCC office to recruit and elect a new representative in accordance with the TriPartite Board Composition Requirements in Section 2.01.

2.07 Sub Committees

Should the CSBGAC determine the need for special sub-committees, the Chairperson shall appoint all sub-committees and designate the chairperson(s) thereof.

2.08 Compensation

CSBGAC members shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for any necessary, actual, and documented expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. Reimbursements to members for such expenses shall be made in accordance with any applicable Federal, State and/or County laws, regulations, rules and/or procedures and shall be overseen by the HS Program Manager. All reimbursable expenses shall be invoiced to the County no later than ninety (90) days after being incurred.

2.09 Removal from the Advisory Council

CSBGAC members may be removed by the BOCC at any time for good cause, which shall include but not be limited to neglect of duty or misconduct in office. CSBGAC members may also be removed by the BOCC at any time if the BOCC determines that such action is in the best interest of the County.

3.00 ARTICLE III – ADVISORY COUNCIL OFFICERS AND MEMBERS - DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

3.01 Officers

Chairperson: It shall be the responsibility of the Chairperson to preside over all meetings, to appoint all standing and temporary committees, and to coordinate with Human Services staff on agendas for all regular and study meetings of the CSBGAC.

Vice-Chairperson: In the case of absence or disability of the Chairperson, the Vice-Chairperson shall perform the functions of the office of the Chairperson.

Secretary: The Secretary shall be a non-member recording secretary provided by the Human Services Department to record the minutes and proceedings of all meetings. The Secretary is not considered an officer of the Advisory Council, but rather a staff member serving at the pleasure of the HS Program Manager.

3.02 Voting

Each member of the CSBGAC has one vote on all matters pertaining to the Council's business, unless the member has a conflict of interest regarding the matter. No proxy votes shall be allowed. Motions shall be determined by majority vote of all members present except as described in 3.02.1. See 3.04 for Manners of Voting.

3.02.1 All motions which propose that the CSBGAC recommend any amendments to the bylaws to the BOCC shall require approval of seventy-five percent (75%) of the currently appointed members

of the CSBGAC. Subsequent to any such motion passed, enactment of change is the authority of the BOCC.

3.03 Quorum

A quorum of the Advisory Council shall be fifty-one percent (51%) of the members eligible to vote. No official business of the Advisory Council can be conducted without a quorum being called.

3.04 Manner of Voting

Voting in person is the primary method. However, voting can be by roll call, voice vote, written ballot, e-mail, telephone call, text message or other manner as deemed appropriate by the CSBGAC and in designated circumstances. Under no circumstances shall any business of the CSBGAC be conducted by secret ballot.

3.05 Attendance Policy

Members are required to attend seventy-five percent (75%) of the regular meetings per year. If a member misses over 75%, it may be considered neglect of duty and the member may be removed from the Advisory Council at the discretion of the Council (See 2.09 Removal from the Advisory Council).

4.00 <u>ARTICLE IV – MEETINGS</u>

4.01 Annual Meeting

The Advisory Council shall meet annually in March, at which time officers shall be elected.

4.02 Regular and Study Meetings

In addition to the annual March election meeting, the CSBGAC shall meet on a regular basis at a time and location established by the CSBGAC, unless canceled by the Council at the previous meeting or by the Chairperson by verbal or written notice to the members at least one (1) day prior to the scheduled meeting.

4.03 Special Meetings

Special meetings may be called by the Chairperson, by a majority of the membership of the CSBGAC, or by the Board of County Commissioners. Notice of such meeting shall be made at least three (3) days prior to the meeting or in the case of an emergency by telephone at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the meeting.

4.04 Executive Session

The Advisory Council may, by majority vote of the members present, go into executive session to consider and discuss any matters as may be provided by law. No formal action on any matter may be taken while in executive session.

4.05 Notices

Meeting notices, including agendas of regular and special meetings, shall be sent to all current CSBGAC members at least three (3) days prior to the scheduled meeting date. Meeting notices shall also be posted on the Adams County website. Meetings that require additional notice as prescribed by Federal or State law or regulation will be announced as required.

5.00 ARTICLE V - OPEN MEETINGS LAW AND OPEN RECORDS ACT

All business conducted and official actions taken by the CSBGAC shall be in accordance with the Colorado Open Meetings Law, § 24-6-401, et seq., C.R.S., as amended, the Colorado Open Records Act, § 24-72-201, et seq., C.R.S., as amended, and any other applicable federal or state laws, rules, or regulations.

All Advisory Council meetings shall be open to the public, except as otherwise provided by law.

6.00 ARTICLE VI - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

6.01 Primary Authority

The primary authority of procedure and parliamentary law shall be the bylaws.

6.02 Secondary Authority

The secondary authority of procedure and parliamentary law shall be the informal rules of procedure decided on from time to time by the Advisory Council.

7.00 ARTICLE VII - POLICIES

7.01 Conflict of Interest Policy

Adams County Community Services Block Grant Advisory Council (CSBGGAC) members, officers, volunteers, and key employees must act at all times in the best interests of Adams County Human Services. Council members, officers, volunteers, and key employees shall disclose all potential and actual conflicts of interest to the Adams County staff and, as required, remove themselves from all discussion and voting on any related matter.

7.02 Every member is expected to follow the Conflict of Interest Policy and will confirm by signing annually.

BACKGROUND:

The County's Human Services Department received Federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Block Grant funds to implement its Colorado Works Program and to assist with the goals of the Human Services Department Workforce and Business Center (WBC) TANF program. The program has proven to be successful in preventing and reducing the incidence of out-of-wedlock pregnancies, improving the knowledge, skills, and behavior of new mothers in regards to prenatal and postnatal care, parenting, and pregnancy-related issues.

The services provided by the Tri-County Health Department's (TCHD) Nurse Home Visits Prenatal and Postnatal Education Program addresses the third purpose of TANF: To prevent and reduce the incidence of out-of-wedlock pregnancies. TCHD has provided high quality nurse visitation services in the homes of new and expectant mothers, as well as classroom instruction. First time program participants receive weekly visits in their homes, or at another location for the first month, then bi-weekly up to two years.

The home visits component of the program addresses:

- Any health issues and assist parents navigating healthcare systems
- Developmental screening of children
- Prenatal and postpartum assessments and education

- Family planning and education and referrals to family planning services
- Perinatal depression assessment, substance use assessment, and referrals to mental health services when needed
- Addressing parenting and life course development

In addition, classes conducted at the Adams County Human Services Center, Adams County School Districts, and other locations. Topics include: birth control and sexually transmitted infection, caregiver and baby education, and perinatal mental health.

The Request for Proposal was solicited through the Rocky Mountain Bid System on February 14, 2017, and approved by the Board of County Commissioners for award to the Tri-County Health Department for a one-year agreement with two one-year renewal options.

The Human Services Department is pleased with the Tri-County Health Department services and they have met the expectations of the agreement for the first nine months by serving forty-two (42) families with in-home visitation services (75% from the TANF Basic Cash Assistance program). Provided one hundred fifty-nine (159) home visits and facilitated thirty-five (35) classes. Since there was no existing caseload when the program began, fewer families have been served than what will be served next year, and less than the entire agreement amount will be expended.

The total cost for Amendment One will be in the amount of three hundred twenty-three thousand eight hundred ninety-nine dollars and no cents (\$323,899.00). Eighty-five (85%) percent is covered by federal funding with Adams County responsible for the remaining fifteen (15%) percent.

The service effective date will be from June 1, 2018, through May 31, 2019.

The services provided by Shiloh House, Inc., developed through a collaborative County wide planning team, established a youth shelter and assessment center for Adams County. Shiloh House, Inc., provides an emergency shelter for children in crisis as well as a residential facility for children needing long-term treatment. They also provide mental health, comprehensive assessments, case management, day treatment, and recreational activities. The Sanctuary, a Shiloh House, Inc., facility, guarantees Adams County 28 beds, which also includes a juvenile assessment center, and houses the Senate Bill 94 program. The location of Shiloh House, Inc., facilities allows children to remain in their communities, close to their families, their home schools, and churches. Shiloh House, Inc., is unique in its ability to provide these services and is an approved sole source provider.

SUMMARY OF APPLICATION

Background:

On February 14, 2018, the Board of County Commissioners (BoCC) directed staff to review the County's development standards and requirements for temporary use permits for fireworks stands/tents and make recommendations for policy adjustments to address issues arising from sale and use of fireworks in the County.

Staff is recommending certain changes to the County's development standards to provide greater clarity regarding the sale of fireworks in the County. The proposed language specifies that only permissible fireworks, as defined by the Colorado Revised Statutes, are permitted with the issuance of a temporary use permit. Permissible fireworks are generally those that do not explode or leave the ground. Impermissible fireworks are those that explode, leave the ground, or project or disburse any metal, glass, or brittle fragments (e.g. bottle rockets). The proposed text amendments also include a recommendation to change the amount of insurance required for

permissible fireworks stands from \$400,000 to \$1,000,000. This recommended change is to ensure such insurance aligns with similar requirements for other uses and also adequate to fulfill the intended purpose for such insurance. In addition, the amendment proposes to include an additional criterion for the issuance of a temporary use permit that is based on prior violations of the County's performance standards.

For a summary description of all the changes to chapters four and eleven (Chapters 4 & 11) of the Development Standards to be amended, see Exhibit 2.1.

On May 8, 2018, the Board of County Commissioners approved a 30-day moratorium on the issuance of temporary use permits for fireworks stands. The purpose of the moratorium was to ensure that any new applications would be subject to the most current version of standards. Staff is requesting the moratorium be lifted upon the Board of County Commissioners decision on this case.

Development Standards and Regulations:

Section 2-02-13 of the Adams County Development Standards and Regulations details the procedures for amendments to the text of the standards and regulations. Only the Board of County Commissioners may, after a recommendation from the Planning Commission, adopt a resolution amending the text of the standards and regulations.

Section 2-02-13-06-01 of the Development Standards and Regulations lists three criteria for reviewing text amendments. The first two criteria require consistency with the Comprehensive Plan and the purpose of the Development Standards. The third criterion requires the text amendment to not be detrimental to the majority of persons or property in the surrounding areas nor to the community in general. The changes proposed in the subject text amendment are consistent with the County's Comprehensive Plan, the purpose of the Development Standards and Regulations, and will not be detrimental to the residents of Adams County. The changes will enhance the County's requirements and performance standards for temporary use permits for sale of fireworks and ensure protection of the health and safety of all residents of the County.

A summary of each chapter and proposed changes, including the purpose for the text amendments, is outlined below:

Chapter 2:

The change in this chapter is to include one additional criterion for the approval of a temporary use permit for "Permissible Fireworks Stands." The criterion requires an applicant to demonstrate the ability and/or history to comply with the County's Regulations.

Chapter 4:

The changes in this chapter will revise the name of "Fireworks Stands' to "Permissible Fireworks Stands." These changes are intended to specify and reinforce the County's requirements that only "permissible fireworks' as defined by Colorado Statute are allowed in the County.

The amount of insurance required for permissible fireworks stands is also proposed to be increased from \$400,000 to \$1,000,000. The Board of County Commissioners, in 1991, adopted the requirement for providing \$400,000 insurance for operation of fireworks stands. The recommendation for the increase and adjustment is to ensure the required insurance is adequate to fulfill the intended purpose for the requirement in the current time.

PLANNING COMMISSION UPDATE:

The Planning Commission (PC) considered this case on May 10, 2018. Ms. Karen Boydston of Pyro City Denver (a fireworks retailer) spoke at the public hearing and informed the PC that the proposed changes are consistent with requirements of many jurisdictions that she operates such businesses. She stated that she had no issues with the proposed changes, however, recommends that staff expedite the review of applications after adoption of the new regulations. This is to allow adequate time for the sale of the fireworks products.

The Planning Commission voted (7-0) to recommend approval of the request; however several of members of the Planning Commission expressed an interest for the County to consider the possibility of creating regulations requiring distance separation of the location of fireworks stands from municipalities.

Staff Recommendation:

Based upon the application, and the criteria for approving a text amendment, staff recommends approval of the subject text amendments to the County's Development Standards and Regulations with 3 findings-of-fact. In addition, staff recommends that the 30-day moratorium be lifted with the approval of these regulations.

RECOMMENDED FINDINGS OF FACT REZONING

- 1. The text amendment is consistent with the Adams County Comprehensive Plan.
- 2. The text amendment is consistent with the purposes of these standards and regulations.
- 3. The text amendment will not be detrimental to the majority of persons or property in the surrounding areas nor to the community in general.

CITIZEN COMMENTS

As of writing this report, staff has not received any citizen comments in support of opposition to the proposed text amendments.

Staff reviewed the request and had no concerns with the proposed text amendments.

2-02-12 TEMPORARY USE PERMIT

2-02-12-01 PURPOSE

The purpose of this section is to detail the steps for obtaining a temporary use permit. Temporary uses are those uses which are non-permanent (less than one (1) year) and often support other land uses authorized or permitted in a zone district or public utilities or services, but which, because of their potential impacts require more discretionary review than those uses which are authorized. In addition to meeting applicable performance standards, temporary uses may require the imposition of conditions in order to ensure the number of temporary uses and their location, design, and configuration are appropriate at a particular location during the duration of operation or use.

2-02-12-02 APPLICABILITY

All uses that require a temporary use permit must be processed in accordance with this section. The Director of Community and Economic Development is the permit issuing authority for Temporary Use Permits. The designation of a use as a temporary use does not constitute an authorization or an assurance that such a use will be approved.

2-02-12-03 WHO CAN INITIATE A TEMPORARY USE PERMIT REQUEST

A temporary use permit may be requested by, without limitation, any owner of, or person having an interest in the property on which the temporary use is proposed to be located. The applicant has the burden of proof to demonstrate the use fully complies with these standards and regulations and meets the criteria for approval.

2-02-12-04 TEMPORARY USE PERMIT REVIEW PROCEDURES

A temporary use permit may be approved by the Director of Community and Economic Development (See Steps 1 through 10 below). The Director of Community and Economic Development shall approve, approve with conditions, or deny the temporary use permit based on compliance with the criteria for approval.

2-02-12-05 TEMPORARY USE PERMIT REVIEW STEPS

The processing of a proposed temporary use permit shall be according to, in compliance with, and subject to the provisions contained in Steps 1 through 10 of the Common Development Review Procedures as follows:

- 1. Conceptual Review: Optional.
- Neighborhood Meeting: Optional, unless the Director of Community and Economic Development determines the development proposal could have significant neighborhood impacts.
- 3. Development Application Submittal: All items or documents required for temporary use permits as described in the development application submittal requirements shall be submitted to the Director of Community and Economic Development at least fourteen (14) days prior to the commencement date of the temporary use.
- 4. Determination of Sufficiency: Applicable. No application shall be processed if taxes due are not paid.
- 5. Staff Report: Not applicable.
- 6. Notice: Not applicable.
- 7. Public Hearing: Not applicable.
- 8. Standards: Applicable.
- 9. Conditions of Approval: Applicable. The Director of Community and Economic Development in approving a temporary use permit may attach any conditions necessary to implement the Adams County Comprehensive Plan and to ensure compatibility with adjacent uses. In addition to other conditions the Director of Community and Economic Development may place on a temporary use permit, the Director of Community and Economic Development shall specify the term of the temporary use permit. The term of a temporary use permit shall be limited to the absolute minimum term necessary for the proposed use, but in no case shall exceed ninety (90) days. Section 4-05 specifies the maximum time frame or expiration of specific temporary uses eligible for the temporary use permit. A temporary use permit may be issued annually for the same project. The Director of Community and Economic Development in approving a temporary use permit may condition the approval on one (1) or more of the following:
 - a. A requirement the development or activity proceeds in accordance with a specific site plan and/or development schedule.
 - b. A clear and unobstructed distance of fifty (50) feet is required between the stands/tents and permanent buildings, flammable liquids, and fuel dispensing operations.

Stands

Any stand measuring more than twenty-five (25) feet in length across the face shall have two (2) exits. Exit doors shall be a minimum of twenty (20) inches in width and six (6) feet in height and swing in the direction of egress. Electrical wiring shall meet all requirements of the State of Colorado.

Thank you for allowing Commerce City to comment on land use cases and planning issues in the County that will impact our community. Commerce City has the following direct comments on this specific referral as it relates to Adams County's codes & regulations:

- Commerce City does not allow the sale of fireworks.
- The current Adams County regulations create a significant problem for Commerce City, when it allows firework sales that are literally 100 feet outside of our jurisdiction.
- A specific example are the permitted fireworks sales on a property that is in Adams County at E. 112th Avenue and Hwy 85. This site is completely surrounded by Commerce City, and there is no place for someone who purchases fireworks to go but into Commerce City. Thus, Commerce City police enforcement is being forced to consider the option of waiting on the roadway adjacent to this subject property and seizing all of the fireworks that are purchased. This is not an outcome the city desires, but it must be considered.
- Therefore, Commerce City requests that firework sales not be allowed within a set distance of the Commerce City border (or something to the effect of creating a buffer from municipalities that do not allow firework sales).
- The city looks forward to working with Adams County to establish such "set" distances.

Thus, as currently no buffer is required, the County is providing contrary message to that of our city which unequivocally states that all fireworks are illegal in Commerce City.

MEMO CONTINUED

Given the potential for injury, fire and other unforeseen consequences, the sale of fireworks is considered a significant issue to the health, safety and wellness of our citizens and community.

Therefore, Commerce City requests the following, with the understanding that close and collaborative communication will foster a better process and regulations in the long term:

- 1. Please provide more information regarding other municipalities that are adjacent to Adams County, which allow and which prohibit the sale of fireworks.
- 2. Please provide mapping of locations that Adams County has permitted the sale of fireworks.
- 3. Commerce City requests a copy of all comment letters that Adams County compiles through this referral process. This will help Commerce City gain an early understanding of concerns and comments from various entities.
- 4. As the Adams County public hearings approach, Commerce City would request a copy of the proposed staff reports for both Planning Commission and the County Commissioners.
- 5. Commerce City would like to see alternative spacing requirements that Adams County would consider for any proposed fireworks sales from an adjacent municipality's boundaries.
