WHEREAS, the Rangeview Library District (the "RLD") is a Library District as defined in the Colorado Library Law, § 24-90-101, *et seq.*, of the Colorado Revised Statutes ("C.R.S."); and

WHEREAS, the RLD is a publicly supported library that is principally supported by monies derived from ad valorem property taxation; and

WHEREAS, the RLD provides library services for all of Adams County, with the exception of the portions of the cities of Aurora and Westminster and School District 26-J located in Adams County, Colorado (the "County"); and

WHEREAS, on August 15, 2018, the Board of Trustees for Rangeview Library district (the "Trustees") adopted a resolution requesting the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") place an issue on the November 6, 2018 election ballot requesting voter approval to increase by up to 2.2 mills the ad valorem property tax levy for the RLD, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as "Exhibit A"; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to § 24-90-112(1)(b)(III), C.R.S., upon request by the Trustees, the Board must submit to a vote of the registered electors residing within the library's legal service area a proposition containing the desired maximum tax levy specified in the request.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado:

1. Pursuant to § 1-5-203(3), C.R.S., the Board hereby authorizes and directs that the following ballot issue be certified herewith to the Adams County Clerk and Recorder ("Clerk and Recorder") for submission to the registered electors in the RLD service area to be included on the ballot for the November 6, 2018 coordinated general election:

- 2. This Resolution shall serve to set the ballot title and text of the ballot issue.

The election shall be conducted by the Adams County Clerk and Recorder in accordance with the Uniform Election Code, C.R.S §1-1-101, et. seq., and other laws and regulations of the State of Colorado, including without limitation, the requirements of article X, section 20 of the Colorado Constitution (hereinafter "TABOR").
- 4. The Clerk and Recorder shall cause all acts required or permitted by the Uniform Election Code and the Rules relevant to be performed by the Clerk and Recorder or designees.
- 5. The Clerk and Recorder shall cause a notice of election to be published in accordance with the laws of the State of Colorado, including but not limited to, the Uniform Election Code and TABOR.

- 6. The Clerk and Recorder shall mail a TABOR notice package to all active registered voter households in the RLD service area, pursuant to Colo. Const., art. X, § 203(3)(b), which shall include the ballot issue adopted herein.
- 7. Pursuant to §§ 24-90-112(1)(b)(I) and 24-90-103(12), C.R.S., as amended, the Clerk and Recorder is directed to publish the text of this Resolution once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the RLD service area or in more than one newspaper if no single newspaper is generally circulated throughout the RLD service area. Not less than seven days, excluding the day of the first publication but including the day of the last publication, shall intervene between the first and the last publications.
- 8. All prior acts, orders or resolutions, or parts thereof, by the County inconsistent or in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency or conflict.
- 9. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be adjudged invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining sections, paragraphs, clauses or provisions of this Resolution, it being the intention that the various parts hereof are severable.

WHEREAS, Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution ("TABOR") requires voter approval of any new tax, the creation of any debt and for spending above limits established by TABOR; and

WHEREAS, November 6, 2018, is one of the election dates at which ballot issues may be submitted to the eligible electors of the District pursuant to TABOR; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to set forth certain procedures concerning the conduct of the election; and

WHEREAS, the Board elects to utilize the provisions of the Uniform Election Code of 1992 (the "Code") in order to conduct a coordinated election with the County Clerk of the County on November 6, 2018 (the "Election"); and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the interest of the District and the public interest and necessity require that the Board request that the BOCC submit to the registered electors of the District the issue of whether the District may increase the mill levy for purposes set forth in the ballot question.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF RANGEVIEW LIBRARY DISTRICT (ANYTHINK), IN THE COUNTY OF ADAMS AND

#### STATE OF COLORADO:

Section 1. All action heretofore taken (not inconsistent with the provisions of this resolution) by the Board and the officers of the District, directed toward the Election be, and the same hereby is, ratified, approved and confirmed.

Section 2. The Board has determined, and hereby determines, that the interest of the District and the public interest and necessity demand and require that the Board submit to the registered electors of the District the ballot question described herein authorizing the District to increase the mill levy for purposes described in the ballot question District.

Section 3. Pursuant to Section 24-90-112(1)(b)(III), the District requests the BOCC cause to be submitted for a vote of the registered electors residing in the District to on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, as part of the County coordinated election, the question set forth in Section 4 of this resolution.

Section 4. The question shall be in substantially the following form:

- EXPANDING LIBRARY PROGRAMS FOR KIDS, TEENS, FAMILIES, ADULTS AND SENIORS, INCLUDING LITERACY PROGRAMS, AFTER SCHOOL ARTS AND SCIENCE PROGRAMS, AND MENTORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES;

AND ANY CONSTITUTIONAL LIMITS, INCLUDING ARTICLE X, SECTION 20 OF THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION, THAT WOULD OTHERWISE APPLY?

Section 5. Michele M. Barrasso, shall be the designated election official for purposes of performing acts required or permitted by law in connection with the Election and is authorized by the Board to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the County Clerk pursuant to Section 1-7-116, C.R.S., in connection with the Election.

Section 6. The officers and employees of the District are directed to take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this resolution, including, without limitation, delivery of a copy of this resolution to the BOCC pursuant to Section 24-90-112(1)(b)(III), C.R.S.

Section 7. All acts, orders or resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with this resolution are repealed.

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# RESOLUTION APPROVING SPECIAL WARRANTY DEED FROM ADAMS COUNTY TO THE STATE OF COLORADO FOR LAND FOR THE ADAMS YOUTH SERVICES CENTER

WHEREAS, by means of an Intergovernmental Agreement from December 2017, Adams County has agreed to convey property to the State of Colorado for the construction and operation of a youth detention center known as the Adams Youth Services Center; and,

WHEREAS, on June 12, 2018, via resolution, Adams County approved a Special Warranty Deed to convey land to the State of Colorado for the purpose of constructing and operating the Adams Youth Services Center; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the Special Warranty Deed from Adams County to the State of Colorado for land for the Adams Youth Services Center, a copy of which is attached hereto, is hereby approved, to become effective only upon closing the transaction.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the attached Special Warranty Deed replaces and supersedes the June 12, 2018 Special Warranty Deed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board of County Commissioners be authorized to execute said Special Warranty Deed on behalf of Adams County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a member of the County Manager's Office is authorized to execute any customary, non-contractual documents at closing.

#### SPECIAL WARRANTY DEED

THIS SPECIAL WARRANTY DEED, made this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, 2018, between the County of Adams, State of Colorado, the legal address of which is 4430 S. Adams County Parkway, Brighton, CO 80601 ("Grantor"), and the State of Colorado, acting by and through the Department of Human Services, for the use and benefit of the Adams Youth Services Center, the legal address of which is 1575 Sherman Street, Denver, CO 80202 ("Grantee"):

### WITNESSETH

That the Grantor, for and in consideration of the promises set forth in an Intergovernmental Agreement between Grantor and Grantee dated December 15, 2017, and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and conveyed, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell, convey, and confirm, unto the Grantee, its successors and assigns forever, all the real property, together with improvements, if any, situate, lying and being in the County of Adams, State of Colorado, described as follows:

Lot 2, Block 1, Bromley Park Filing No. 101, 7th Amendment, County of Adams, State of Colorado

TOGETHER with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging, or in anywise appertaining, and the rents, issues and profits thereof, and all the estate, right, title, interest, claim and demand whatsoever of the Grantor, either in law or equity, of, in and to the above bargained premises, with the hereditaments and appurtenances;

EXCEPTING all mineral and water rights associated with the Property and any other rights that were retained by KING PAUL 1, LLC, JACOBS COLORADO LLC, and IVE COLORADO LLC, as part of those entities' conveyance to Grantor, including an easement reserved by said entities and described in Exhibit A.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said premises above bargained and described with the appurtenances, unto the Grantees, its successors and assigns forever.

The Grantor, for itself, its successors and assigns does covenant and agree that it shall and will WARRANT AND FOREVER DEFEND the above-bargained premises in the quiet and peaceable possession of the Grantee, its successors and assigns, against all and every person or persons claiming the whole or any part thereof, by, through or under the Grantor, subject to all matters set forth in attached Exhibit B.

REVERTER. Should either of the following events occur, the Grantee shall convey the property back to Grantor, upon the terms and conditions of the December 15, 2017 Intergovernmental Agreement between Adams County and the State of Colorado Regarding the Acquisition and Development of the Adams Youth Services Center:

- 1. Grantee fails to construct the Adams Youth Services Center by December 31, 2024, or
- 2. Grantee constructs the Adams Youth Services Center but then ceases to use the Property for use by the Department of Human Services for a consecutive period of eighteen (18) months. In the event of an act of God or other extenuating circumstance where the Grantee's non-use is intended to be temporary, the Grantee may, at least thirty days prior to the expiration of the eighteen month period, submit a written request to the Grantor for an additional eighteen months to bring the Property back into compliance with the terms of the IGA. The Grantor may, in its sole discretion, grant or deny the requested extension. Grantee's transfer of the Property back to the Grantor shall be by Special Warranty Deed, subject to land dedications and public utility easements.

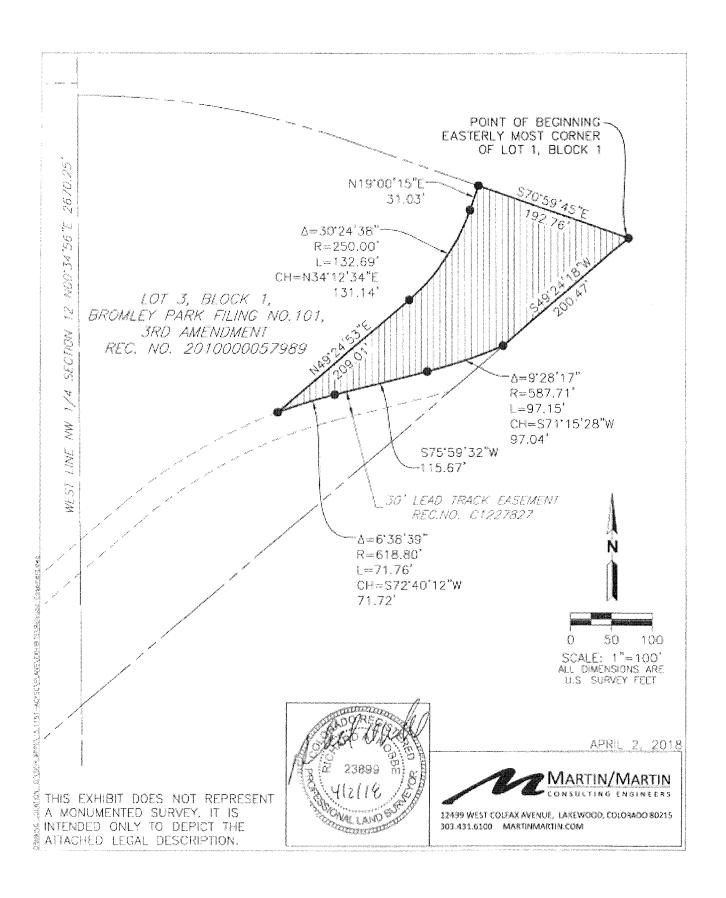

# RESOLUTION APPROVING THE DITCH CROSSING AGREEMENT BETWEEN ADAMS COUNTY AND THE NEW BRANTNER EXTENSION DITCH COMPANY

Resolution 2018 -

WHEREAS, Adams County owns land located in Unincorporated Adams County within the Riverdale Regional Park; and,

WHEREAS, by means of the attached Ditch Crossing Agreement, Adams County intends to install 2 culverts for utilities and roadway bridge crossings at the Brantner Canal to allow ingress and egress to the future Riverdale Animal Shelter; and,

WHEREAS, the New Brantner Extension Ditch Company (New Brantner) fee for the crossings is twenty-five thousand dollars.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the Ditch Crossing agreement between Adams County and the New Brantner Extension Ditch Company, a copy of which is attached hereto, is hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED; that the Chair is hereby authorized to execute said Ditch Crossing Agreement on behalf of Adams County.

### CROSSING AGREEMENT

- PARTIES. The parties to this Agreement are the New Brantner Extension Ditch Company, a Colorado mutual Canal company ("New Brantner"), and Adams County (the "Licensee"). New Brantner and Licensee are jointly referred to as the Parties.
- 2. RECITALS. The Licensee desires to obtain the permission of New Brantner for the installation of two (2) sixteen feet by six feet (16' x 6') concrete box culverts to support two (2) road way crossings of the Brantner Canal. Specifically, the center point of the north crossing is located N11°04'26"W a distance of 1515.62LF from the Southeast corner of Section 33, Township I South, Range 67 W of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Adams County, Colorado and the center point of the south crossing is located N42°25'06"W a distance of 1075.47LF from the Southeast corner of Section 33, Township I South, Range 67 W of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Adams County, Colorado. Licensee owns or has acquired the right to utilize property at the aforementioned locations depicted more specifically in the attached EXHIBIT A Vicinity Map. New Brantner agrees to permit the proposed installation, subject to the terms, conditions, covenants and agreements set forth in this Agreement. Accordingly, in consideration of the mutual promises set forth in this Agreement, the Parties covenant and agree as follows:

#### 3. CONSTRUCTION.

- 3.1 Pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, the Licensee is granted a license to install the above referenced sixteen feet by six feet (16' x 6') concrete box culverts and cross the Canal during this single event at two (2) locations with a roadway crossing/bridge and up to five (5) sleeves for utilities within the same footprint of each crossing for the purpose of accessing and providing utilities to the Riverdale Animal Shelter (the "Installation") pursuant to the plans and specifications approved by New Brantner and attached as EXHIBIT B Ditch Crossing Design with Addendum. New Brantner's review of the plans and specifications is solely for its own benefit and creates no obligation on New Brantner. No use of the ditch right of way is approved in this agreement beyond the aforementioned Installation.
- 3.2 There shall be no disturbance or damage made to the Canal, bottoms, sides, banks, and associated eighty foot (80') easement. Should any disturbance occur to the canal, bottoms, sides, banks or easement, repairs shall be made immediately (or as soon as practical) such that any area impacted shall be restored to their original condition so the flow of water in the Canal runs at the original amount and velocity. Any and all existing fencing and other facilities appurtenant to New Brantner's easement shall be replaced in a condition at least equal to the condition of such facilities and appurtenances prior to construction. No above ground structures shall be erected in the Canal easement other than the Installation. The Ditch Company President and Ditch Superintendent should be contacted immediately should any damage or disturbance occur.
- 3.3 The Licensee shall not spill any dirt, debris or other foreign material into the Canal. In the event that dirt, debris or other foreign material is spilled into the Canal, the Licensee agrees to completely clean the affected portions of the Canal.

- 3.4 The Licensee agrees that the Installation shall proceed expeditiously and with reasonable diligence from the commencement of construction to its completion. The Installation shall commence and be fully completed before March 15, 2019. If the Installation has not been commenced by March 15, 2019, this Agreement expires and is of no force or effect. Under no circumstances shall any construction activity take place in the ditch proper or under the ditch between March 15th and November 1st of 2018 or of any other year should the terms of this agreement be extended.
- 3.5 If the Licensee's construction or maintenance interrupts New Brantner's water supply for any reason, the Licensee shall pay as liquidated damages the amount of \$1,500.00 per day, until such time as Brantner's full diversions and deliveries to all shareholders on the system can resume.
- 3.6 Licensee is responsible, at its own expense, for obtaining all local, state and federal permits or approvals and for compliance with all local, state and federal laws and regulations including but not limited to land use and environmental laws and regulations, and specifically including the Endangered Species Act, prior to beginning construction or maintenance operations. Licensee shall, to the extent allowed by law, indemnify New Brantner for any and all costs, damages, fines and fees, including reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by New Brantner as a result of Licensee's failure to obtain such permits or approvals or failure to comply with all applicable laws and regulations.
- 3.7 The term of this license shall be perpetual so long as the terms herein are complied with.
- 3.8 Neither the installation, nor any portion of the Licensee's project in the area described above shall allow any storm or flood water to enter the Brantner Ditch during construction or at any time thereafter. Licensee has agreed to install a force main to take storm water away from the ditch using pumps and to bypass the ditch with all produced storm water as depicted on EXHIBIT C Limits of Developed Area New Brantner will be included in the review of the storm water plans as they are developed to ensure no portion of the developed stormwater will enter the Brantner Ditch.
- 4. LICENSE FEE. Licensee shall pay to New Brantner a license fee of \$25,000 at the time of execution of this Crossing Agreement. This license fee shall be in addition to any other costs for which the Licensee is responsible pursuant to this Agreement including attorney and engineering fees as mentioned in ¶6.

#### INSPECTION.

5.1 The Licensee shall notify New Brantner at least five (5) days prior to the commencement of the installation or repair of the installation, permitted by the Agreement,

except for emergency repairs which are provided for in §7 of this Agreement. New Brantner is permitted to inspect the Installation or repairs to the Installation during construction. Upon completion of the installation or repairs to the Installation, New Brantner may inspect the Installation.

5.2 New Brantner's right to inspect the Licensee's Installation or repairs to the Installation in no way relieves the Licensee of its liability for improper installation. New Brantner's inspection is solely for the benefit of New Brantner and creates no obligation to New Brantner.

#### 6. REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES.

- 6.1 The Licensee agrees to reimburse New Brantner (or pay directly) for all reasonable engineering and legal costs incurred by New Brantner in preparing and approving this Agreement and the costs of inspection as described in §5. Costs chargeable to the Licensee shall be paid within 30 days of the billing date.
- 6.2 Statements for the costs chargeable to the Licensee hereunder will be forwarded to the Licensee and the same shall be paid to New Brantner.

#### MAINTENANCE.

- 7.1 The Licensee specifically agrees and pledges to clean, maintain, and repair the Installation described in EXHIBIT A so as to allow the free and un-impeded flow of water through the installation and not to require New Brantner to clean, maintain, or repair it. If the Licensee fails to properly clean, maintain, or repair any portion of the Installation for which it is responsible after ten days' notice of the need for same, New Brantner may, at its own option, conduct its own maintenance, repair, or removal of the Installation, and the Licensee shall reimburse New Brantner for the cost of such work within 30 days. In the event the Licensee fails to clean, maintain, or repair the Installation, it shall be held liable for any loss, damage, or injury to New Brantner. If New Brantner conducts its own maintenance, repair, or replacement, it does not waive the right to hold Licensee liable for damages caused by the Licensee's failure to maintain, repair, or replace.
- 7.2 In the event of an emergency, New Brantner or the Licensee may conduct maintenance or repair immediately, giving notice to the other party as soon as possible at the emergency contacts identified in §11. If New Brantner conducts emergency work, it shall be reimbursed for the cost of the work. Under no circumstances shall New Brantner be responsible or held liable for damages to the installation resulting from the maintenance or repair to the Canal.
- 8. WATER LOSS. The Licensee agrees that the Installation will not increase carriage or transit loss over the loss which occurred historically. The Licensee agrees to compact earth materials so that such additional water losses will not occur. If the Licensee's Installation increases carriage or transit loss in the Canal, the Licensee agrees to repair the construction to prevent such additional loss.

- 9. LIABILITY. By virtue of entering into this Agreement, New Brantner; (1) assumes no liability for the use, operation, or existence of the Licensee's installation; and (2) assumes no additional responsibilities or obligations related to the Licensee's future or additional activities in the area described in EXHIBIT A which are required by this Agreement.
- 10. EASEMENT RIGHTS. The License granted to the Licensee herein in no way restricts New Brantner's right to the use of its easement to construct, operate or maintain all existing structures and facilities of the Canal.
- 11. NOTICES. Any notice required or permitted by this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been sufficiently given for all purposes if sent by certified or registered mail, postage and fees prepaid, addressed to the party to whom such notice is intended to be given at the address set forth below, or at such other address as has been previously furnished in writing to the other party or parties. RESOLUTION CHANGING THE NAME OF THE FRONT RANGE AIRPORT ADVISORY BOARD TO THE COLORADO AIR AND SPACE PORT ADVISORY BOARD AND AMENDING THE COLORADO AIR AND SPACE PORT ADVISORY BOARD BY-LAWS TO REFLECT NAME CHANGE

WHEREAS, on December 11, 2013, the Board of County Commissioners (BoCC) of Adams County, Colorado determined that the Front Range Airport would begin to be operated as a County Airport pursuant to Colorado Revised Statutes (C.R.S.) § 41-4-101, et. seq.; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Resolution dated January 6, 2014, the BoCC established the Front Range Airport Advisory Board in order to encourage community involvement by individuals with relevant expertise to make recommendations to the BoCC regarding the attraction, recruitment, retention, and infrastructure needs of the Front Range Airport; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Resolution, the board was named the "Front Range Airport Advisory Board"; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Resolution, the board was made up of ten members that are appointed by the BoCC, consisting of the County Manager or designee and members of the community from the following areas: current owners/tenants of the airport, economic development, marketing, UAV sector, space sector, aviation sector, non-aviation business sector, Adams County citizen representation, and intergovernmental representation; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Resolution the Front Range Airport Advisory Board was to be implemented and administered in accordance with the guidelines outlined and according to policies and procedures to be established by the County Manager; and,

WHEREAS, the BoCC has approved changing the name of the Front Range Airport Advisory Board to the "Colorado Air and Space Port Advisory Board"; and,

WHEREAS, the BoCC wishes to change the Colorado Air and Space Port Advisory Board bylaws to reflect said name change and to add a minimum fifty-one percent aerospace industry composition requirement to the by-laws.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the Front Range Airport Advisory Board shall, hereafter, be known as the Colorado Air and Space Port Advisory Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the attached by-laws reflecting the Colorado Air and Space Port Advisory Board name and adding a fifty-one percent aerospace industry composition requirement, are hereby approved.

# BYLAWS THE COLORADO AIR AND SPACE PORT ADVISORY BOARD Adams County, Colorado

#### **ARTICLE 1**

#### PURPOSE AND ORGANIZATION

**SECTION 1.** The purpose of the COLORADO AIR AND SPACE PORT Advisory Board ("Advisory Board") is to provide advice and recommendations to the Adams County Board of County Commissioners ("BoCC") on matters of policy and strategic long-term development issues affecting the COLORADO AIR AND SPACE PORT. The Advisory Board will serve in an advisory capacity to the County Commissioners.

**SECTION 2**. The Advisory Board shall consist of eleven members. The County Manager shall be one of the eleven members. The BoCC shall appoint the remaining ten members of the Advisory Board. The membership will consist of the following required member positions, and at least fifty-one percent of the total membership shall be comprised of representatives with an Aerospace or Space related background:

**Required Advisory Board Membership** 

Background	Category
County Manager (Alternate—Deputy)	County Representative
Executive Director ACED	Economic Development
Mayor—City of Aurora	Intergovernmental

The term of members shall either be two (2) years or four (4) years in length, or until a successor has been duly appointed. The initial term shall be determined at the time of appointment. The term shall commence on the date of appointment. A vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term of a member in the same manner as an original appointment.

The members shall receive no compensation for their services, but may be reimbursed for all necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as members of the Advisory Board; provided, that all such expenses shall be approved for reimbursement by the Advisory Board prior to the time they are incurred.

Any member may be removed by the BoCC at any time, with or without cause.

The COLORADO AIR AND SPACE PORT Director and staff shall provide administrative support for the Advisory Board.

#### **ARTICLE II**

#### POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE ADVISORY BOARD

**SECTION 1.** The Advisory Board will be advisory to the BoCC, and may take no action that binds the BoCC. Advisory Board members shall abstain from participation in discussions or matters in which they may have a financial or vested interest and will comply with the County's ethics policy. In the event of such an interest, an Advisory Board member shall disclose to the Advisory Board that such an interest exists and recuse herself/himself from further participation.

SECTION 2. The Advisory Board will assist with business planning and marketing strategy for the Colorado Air and Spaceport and provide recommendations to the BoCC in those areas.

#### **ARTICLE III**

#### **MEETINGS OF THE ADVISORY BOARD**

**SECTION 1.** Regular meetings of the Advisory Board shall be set annually by the Advisory Board for the forthcoming year at the annual meeting at which the election of officers occurs.

**SECTION 2.** The County Manager or other authorized representative shall prepare a notice of the meeting and an agenda of all matters to come before the meeting, and deliver the same to the Advisory Board prior to the next regular meeting. All meetings shall be subject to the Colorado Open Meetings Law.

**SECTION 3.** Special meetings of the Advisory Board may be called by the Chairperson or County Manager at any time by giving notice of the time and place of such meeting to all members thereof.

**SECTION 4**. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the members of the Advisory Board appointed and qualified at any given time.

#### **ARTICLE IV**

#### **OFFICERS AND THEIR DUTIES**

**SECTION 1.** The officers of the Advisory Board shall be as follows:

<u>Chairperson</u>, who shall be elected by the Advisory Board from its members and who shall preside at all meetings of the Advisory Board.

<u>Vice Chairperson</u>, who shall be elected by the Advisory Board from its members and who, in the absence or disqualification or disability of the Chairperson, shall perform duties of the Chairperson.

**SECTION 2.** At the first regular meeting of the Advisory Board, an election of officers for the forthcoming twelve (12) months will be held, and those newly elected officers shall assume their positions upon election.

#### ARTICLE V

#### **RULES AND PROCEDURES**

The Advisory Board shall conduct its business through general parliamentary procedure and may adopt such other appropriate rules and procedures for the conduct of meetings and for the transaction of the Advisory Board's business.

#### **ARTICLE VI**

#### **AMENDMENTS TO BYLAWS**

**SECTION 1.** The Advisory Board may, by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote, amend these Bylaws or any provisions or section thereof, at any time when the same is not in conflict or in contravention of any of the laws of the State of Colorado or regulations applicable thereto, and such amendments shall be subject to approval by the BoCC. Notice of the proposed amendments must be furnished to the Advisory Board members not less than ten (10) days prior to the meeting at which said amendments are to be considered. A copy of the Bylaws will be filed with the office of the County Manager.

The above and foregoing Bylaws are hereby adopted as the Bylaws of the COLORADO AIR AND SPACE PORT Advisory Board of Adams County, Colorado.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) was established by Congress in 1965. The Act designated that a portion of receipts from offshore oil and gas leases be placed into a fund annually for state and local conservation, as well as for the protection of parks, forest and wildlife areas.

LWCF plays a key role with state and local governments to provide resources for local recreation facilities such as parks, playgrounds and sports fields, but also critical preemptive programs including wildfire and flood mitigation.

LWCF has invested more than \$268 million to protect Colorado's outdoor places, public access to trails, climbing spots, sportsmen access, and to build close to home parks. From national forests, to Colorado's breathtaking national parks and wildlife refuges, LWCF has protected places like Mesa Verde National Park, Canyons of the Ancients National Monument, Arapaho National Forest, Two Ponds National Wildlife Refuge, and Denver Urban Gardens. Colorado's booming \$28 billion outdoor recreation industry is an economic powerhouse – supporting 229,000 jobs which generate \$9.7 billion in wages and salaries and produces \$2 billion annually in state and local tax revenue.

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LWCF authorization expires in late September unless Congressional action is taken to reauthorize LWCF.

WHEREAS, in 1965, Congress established the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) and designated a portion of receipts from offshore oil and gas leases to be placed into a fund annually for state and local conservation, as well as for the protection of parks, forests, and wildlife areas; and,

WHEREAS, in fiscal year 2018, LWCF received \$425 million; and,

WHEREAS, the program is divided into two distinct funding components: a federal program that funds the purchase of land and water areas for conservation and recreation purposes and a state managed matching grant program which provides funds to states for planning, developing, and acquiring land and water areas for state and local parks and recreation facilities; and,

WHEREAS, in Colorado, LWCF has provided more than \$268 million in funding and has leveraged more than \$147 million for local government and state park outdoor recreational investments in Colorado; and,

WHEREAS, in Colorado, since 2011, LWCF has protected more than 10,000 acres of public lands valued by sportsmen and women; and,

WHEREAS, this land helps support Colorado's economy by bringing in \$28 billion in consumer spending and 229,000 direct jobs for tourism and outdoor recreation; and,

WHEREAS, preparation for natural disasters in Colorado is essential, and money from LWCF is used to help prevent and remediate natural disasters like fires and floods; and,

WHEREAS, in Colorado, agriculture is important to the economy and our Western heritage, and LWCF is essential in protecting agricultural land; and,

WHEREAS, for over 50 years, LWCF has played a critical role in providing funding for conserving national parks and forests, rivers, farms and ranches, fish and wildlife, sportsmen and recreation access and trails, and has additionally provided funding to conserve state and local parks and facilities throughout Colorado and the nation, and should therefore be fully funded.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissions of Adams County, State of Colorado, as follows:

- 1. The Adams County Commissioners hereby recommend full funding and permanent reauthorization for the Land and Water Conservation Fund.

Since 1992, as a result of TABOR, the District has experienced a steady decrease in tax revenue. In 2018, the gap between project needs and the funds available is \$24 million dollars. This funding gap has also reduced the District's ability to assist local governments in funding the construction of projects, increasing the financial burden on cities and counties in completing these drainage and flood control projects.

The Flood Control District Board of Directors has voted unanimously to place a ballot issue before the voters in the election being held on November 6, 2018 for voter approval to close the funding gap. The proposed ballot issue, if passed, would cost the average homeowner \$1.97 (or less than 17 cents/month) per \$100,000 of actual home value in 2019. If passed, the ballot issue

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would provide the District with approximately \$14.9 million dollars in 2019 to carry out its mission of keeping people and property safe from flood damage.

WHEREAS, the Urban Drainage and Flood Control District (the "District") is a body corporate and politic, a political subdivision, and municipal corporation of the State of Colorado, duly organized and existing pursuant to Article 11 of Title 32, C.R.S.; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors (the "Board") of the District primarily consists of elected officials of the cities and counties within the District's boundaries in Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Broomfield, Denver, Douglas, and Jefferson counties and professional stormwater engineers; and

WHEREAS, it is the District's mission to keep people and property safe from flood damage in the Denver metropolitan area and to protect the environment; and

WHEREAS, the District, in carrying out that mission, is responsible for fortifying and restoring the natural and beneficial functions of all the creeks, rivers, and streams within its boundaries in Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Broomfield, Denver, Douglas, and Jefferson counties; and,

WHEREAS, the District also manages thousands of acres of open space in floodplains located within its boundaries; and,

WHEREAS, those floodplain open spaces promote wildlife habitat and provide trails and public recreational access to those open space areas; and,

WHEREAS, the District, as part of its mission, also builds and maintains trails along creeks and rivers including bike paths, walking trails, and bridges that cross those creeks and rivers; and,

WHEREAS, the District manages a network of flood detection and early warning equipment so that if a high water or flood event were about to hit the region, there would be an early warning to the public to prepare and evacuate; and,

WHEREAS, the District, as part of its regular maintenance, removes debris, garbage, and obstructions from streams, creeks, and rivers making them not only safer and more beautiful, but also promoting the recreational use of those waters; and,

WHEREAS, the District partners with local governments, including Adams County to construct drainage and flood control facilities to reduce flooding and thus provides protection to the public and its property; and,

WHEREAS, in recent years, the District has contributed funds and expertise to projects within Adams County; and,

WHEREAS, those drainage and flood control facilities are also designed to increase the quality of the water going into regional streams and lakes; and,

WHEREAS, the District carries out continuing research regarding technology that will make our water cleaner and help the local governments within its boundaries, including Adams County, to comply with the Clean Water Act; and,

WHEREAS, the District is the leading force preventing growth from occurring in low-lying floodplains by assisting local governments, including Adams County in reviewing and evaluating proposed new development for the purpose of ensuring that any new development does not increase the risk of flooding; and,

WHEREAS, the seven-county Denver metropolitan area regularly experiences intense rainfall and through the efforts of the District, the people Adams County are now safer and their property is more secure; and,

WHEREAS, all of these tasks require the expenditure of funds that the District primarily obtains through taxation of property within its boundaries; and,

WHEREAS, since 1992, as a result of TABOR, the District has experienced a steady decrease in tax revenue; and,

WHEREAS, in 2018 the gap between project needs and the funds available is \$24 million dollars; and,

WHEREAS, this funding gap has also reduced the District's ability to assist local governments, including Adams County in funding the construction of projects, increasing the financial burden on Adams County in completing these drainage and flood control projects; and,

# RESOLUTION AMENDING THE ADAMS COUNTY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

WHEREAS, the Adams County Board of County Commissioners adopted a Boards and Commissions Policies and Procedures for the County on April 3, 2018; and,

WHEREAS, the Adams County Board of County Commissioners has a duty and right to appoint citizens to various boards and commissions; and,

WHEREAS, it has been determined that this Boards and Commissions Policies and Procedures is necessary and a best practice to improve the County's process to achieve efficiencies and be more effective in County operations; and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Board of County Commissioners to amend the Interview Process of the Boards and Commissions Policies and Procedures; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments to the Boards and Commissions Policies and Procedures were presented to the Adams County Board of County Commissioners at Study Session on August 28, 2018 during the administrative discussion.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners, County of Adams, State of Colorado, that the amended Boards and Commissions Policies and Procedures, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby approved and adopted to be effective immediately.

# ADAMS COUNTY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

#### **PURPOSE**

This directive sets forth the process for procedures and standards for the appointment, recruitment, and selection of individuals to the County's Boards and Commissions.

#### **POLICY**

The Board of County Commissioners (BoCC) has the duty and right to appoint citizens to various boards and commissions. It is the intent of the BoCC to provide for an orderly process to be followed by County staff and to encourage participation by interested citizens. All appointments and removals are made at the discretion of the BoCC.

#### **DUTIES OF BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS**

Most boards and commissions are advisory and all boards and commissions are subject to the
powers and limitations set forth in statute or authorizing resolution. The duties and authority of
the Adams County boards and commissions can be found on the County's website at the
following link: <a href="http://www.adcogov.org/citizen-advisory-boards-and-commissions">http://www.adcogov.org/citizen-advisory-boards-and-commissions</a>

#### **ADVERTISING AND APPLICATION PROCESS**

- When there are vacancies to be filled, the BoCC staff shall advertise that applications are being accepted through the County's website and social media. Available positions shall be posted for a minimum of ten days.
- Any citizen interested in being appointed or reappointed to a board or commission shall submit
  a completed Application Form to the BoCC Office via the County's website at
  <a href="http://www.adcogov.org/citizen-advisory-boards-and-commissions">http://www.adcogov.org/citizen-advisory-boards-and-commissions</a>, and attach any additional
  information as desired.
- Applicants will be contacted by BoCC staff with next steps and notified of the date and times for interviews, if applicable.
- Citizens are able to apply for a board or commission at anytime through the County's website and their applications will be held by the BoCC Office until a vacancy arises.

#### **MEMBER ELIGIBILITY**

- Applicants must be residents of Adams County unless otherwise specified on the individual board resolution.
- There may be specific eligibility requirements, including qualifications by training or experience, for particular boards and commissions.
- Applications will be sent to the staff liaison(s) and county attorney to determine other eligibility factors as they pertain to each individual board's requirements prior to being considered.

#### **INTERVIEW PROCESS**

- The BoCC will conduct interviews two times annually, generally in the months of January and June schedules permitting. Exceptions will be made if a board is unable to reach a quorum due to membership or the BoCC deems it necessary for any other reason.
- BoCC staff shall select an interview date prior to the start of each process.
- Staff Input/Evaluation: A board liaison will attend interviews with the BoCC to provide input on the ideal characteristics and experience for potential board members as well as provide feedback of current board members; including an attendance report from the previous year.
- When the application deadline has passed, BoCC staff will compile all applications and provide an electronic packet to the BoCC and staff liasions for review.
- The number of applicants selected for interview will vary based on the number of open positions, the qualifications of the applicants, and the number of applications received.
- BoCC staff shall schedule and confirm interviews. Applicants who fail to attend their scheduled interview may forfeit their opportunity for consideration of appointment to a board.
- With the agreement of the applicant, the BoCC may consider an applicant for service on an alternate board if the skills and competencies of the applicant are more suited for service on that board.
- The BoCC may elect to appoint members based on review of their application and staff feedback in lieu of an in person interview.

#### **APPOINTMENT PROCESS**

- After interviews and/or review of applications, the BoCC will give direction to staff to prepare resolutions to fill board vacancies. BoCC staff will prepare a memo to be emailed to the BoCC confirming the appointments to be made.
- BoCC staff shall notify each applicant of the BoCC's appointment decision via email or telephone. Letters will be sent to each individual appointed to a board or commission stating the name of the board to which they have been appointed, the name of the staff liaison for their board, and any other pertinent information relevant to the board position. Applicants will be asked to confirm their intent to serve on each board.
- BoCC staff will also prepare and send letters to those not selected for service.
- BoCC staff will prepare a resolution for each board appointment to be approved by the BoCC at a public hearing.

#### **REQUIRED FORMS**

• Paid board members will be required to complete a W9 Form in order to receive payment.

# **TERM OF OFFICE**

- Term of office shall be set by resolution for each individual board or commission.
- Board members are appointed for a limited purpose and time, and once the assigned term of
  office is completed, they are excused from this appointment unless the BoCC selects them for
  another term of service in accordance with the adopted policy for board and commission
  appointments.

#### **NEW MEMBERS**

Newly appointed board and commission members should make every effort to become as
familiar as possible with all aspects of his or her particular board. To aid in the process, new
members will be contacted by a staff liaison and will be provided with relevant information and
regulations that govern their particular board.

#### **TRAINING**

- Board and commission members shall be required to complete a training course approved by the County Attorney's Office within 60 days of their appointment. Other training may be provided as deemed necessary by the BoCC or staff. Signed forms and training certificates of completion will be kept on file in the BoCC's office.
- Staff liaisons will be required to attend a training course approved by BoCC staff.

#### **ATTENDANCE AT MEETINGS**

- Board and commission members are expected to maintain regular meeting attendance.
   Members to any board or commission can miss no more than two consecutive meetings and no more than three meetings in any calendar year. Once the limit is reached by any member, the information shall be made known to the BoCC and the BoCC may consider vacating the position and will fill the vacancy in accordance with policy.
- Attendance at boards and commissions meetings will be reported to the BoCC on an annual basis for all members.

#### **RESIGNATION PROCESS**

• Should a board member be unable to complete their term, they should immediately notify their staff liaison and BoCC staff in writing. BoCC staff will then work to fill the vacancy in accordance with policy.

#### **RECOGNITION OF BOARD MEMBERS**

• It is the intent of the BoCC to occasionally recognize the work of board and commission members through a recognition dinner or other form of appreciation.

#### **ROLE OF STAFF LIAISON**

- A staff member is assigned to each board or commission to perform support services, provide technical data, prepare agendas, prepare minutes of the meetings, and other related functions.
   The staff member is not entitled to vote or preside over meetings.
- The staff liaison may arrange a meeting with new members prior to the first meeting date for briefings on the duties of the board and background information on items that may be considered at the next meeting.
- The staff liaison is responsible for communicating any changes related to their board or commission to BoCC staff including: updates to staff contacts, updates to bylaws, board member contact information, updates to the enacting resolution.
- Additionally, the staff liaison is responsible for communicating board member resignations to BoCC staff.
- A staff liaison will attend interviews with the BoCC.

#### **CREATION OF A NEW BOARD OR COMMISSION**

- The BoCC may identify the need for a new board or commission and establish one through resolution.
- Changes in the law may also dictate the establishment of a board or commission. It is the responsibility of the County Attorney's Office and individual departments to ensure compliance

with legal obligations for boards and commissions. Individual departments are responsible for the initial resolution establishing a board or commission via the public hearing/study session process already established by the Clerk to the Board. The resolution must include the following information:

- o Scope and responsibility of the board
- Legal authority, if applicable
- Number of members
- Member requirements/qualifications
- o Terms and term lengths
- BoCC staff will work with the staff liaison to set up a web page and recruit for the new board or commission in accordance with policy.
- In consultation with the County Attorney's Office, the staff liaison for the newly established board or commission will be responsible for ensuring that by-laws are adopted. By-laws should be provided to BoCC staff as soon as they are formally adopted.

#### **REVIEW OF POLICIES AND PROCECURES**

• This policy may be reviewed and amended by resolution as deemed necessary by the Board of County Commissioners

### **SUMMARY OF APPLICATION**

### Background

On May 12, 1969, the Board of County Commissioners approved the Van Aire subdivision, which included a landing strip for private airplane uses. The subject property is located in this subdivision.

On May 10, 1977, the Board of County Commissioners approved a conditional use permit to allow a fueling station to support the airport uses in the development. This facility was located on a single-family residential dwelling. However, it was removed in 2008.

On August 26, 2013, the Board of County Commissioners approved a conditional use permit to allow a 4,000 gallon, above-ground fuel storage facility on the subject property. The facility currently provides fuel services to the private airplane owners in the subdivision.

### **Site Characteristics:**

The property is located north of E. 156<sup>th</sup> Ave. and west of Harvest Rd, within the Van Aire subdivision. The existing facility is comprised of a 4,000 gallon, above-ground fuel tank, and 64 square feet shed. The tank is constructed on a concrete pad with bollards around it.

### **Development Standards and Regulations Requirements:**

The subject request falls under the underground fuel storage use category outlined in the County's Development Standards and Regulations. Per Section 3-07-01 of the County's Development Standards, a conditional use permit is required for the use in the A-1 zone district. The Board of County Commissioners also approved a conditional use permit in 2013 to allow the use on the property. This conditional use permit was approved for five years. The request is for renewal of the use of the facility for another five years. Per Section 2-02-08-06 of the County's Development Standards and Regulations, in approving a conditional use permit, the Board of County Commissioners shall find that the use is permitted in the applicable zone district, the proposed use conforms to the purpose of the Development Standards, the conditional use will be compatible with its surrounding area, harmonious with the character of the neighborhood, not detrimental to future development of the area, as well as not detrimental to public health and safety.

From the application documents and County records, the facility has been in operation on the property for the past ten years and has recorded no complaints or had any adverse impacts on the surrounding properties. No landscaping is proposed with the facility. According to the applicant, any installation of landscaping on the property will likely attract wildlife which will be a hazard to airplane landings on the airstrip.

# Future Land Use Designation/Goals of the Comp-Plan for the Area

The future land use designation on the property is Estate Residential. Per Chapter 5 of the County's Comprehensive Plan, the purpose of the Estate Residential future land use designation is to provide opportunities for rural lifestyles or low-intensity neighborhoods outside of municipalities. Estate Residential areas are designated for single-family housing at a lower density, typically no greater than one unit per acre.

Per Chapter 5 of the Comprehensive Plan, the County encourages aviation uses as a form of promoting economic development. The proposed fuel storage facility is to service airplanes in the Van Aire Skyport. This use support alternative mode of transportation in the County and minimizes vehicular traffic on the County's road network. Providing bulk fuel storage on the property also minimizes potential hazard of regularly carrying such fuels on public roads.

### **Compatibility with the Surrounding Land Uses:**

The Van Aire subdivision was created in 1969 as a fly-in community. All of the lots within the subdivision are connected to the airstrip on the property. The airstrip is located at the center of the Van Aire subdivision, and serves as the defining character of the development. The proposed conditional use permit to allow continuous use of an existing fuel storage facility will be compatible with a neighborhood design for private airplane uses.

#### PLANNING COMMISSION UPDATE:

The Planning Commission (PC) considered this case on August 9, 2018, and voted (7-0) to recommend approval of the request. Ms. Linda Alexander, the applicant's representative, spoke at the meeting, and had no concerns with the staff report or presentation. Ms. Alexander informed the Planning Commission of the importance of allowing such a fuel facility in the subdivision. There were no members of the public who spoke at the hearing.

# **Staff Recommendations:**

Based upon the application, the criteria for approval of a conditional use permit outlined in Section 2-02-08-06 of the County's Development Standards, the County's Comprehensive Plan, and a recent site visit, staff recommends approval of the request with 8 findings-of-fact, four conditions, and one note.

#### **Findings-of-fact for Approval:**

- 1. The conditional use is permitted in the applicable zone district.
- 2. The conditional use is consistent with the purposes of these standards and regulations.
- 3. The conditional use will comply with the requirements of these standards and regulations, including but not limited to, all applicable performance standards.
- 4. The conditional use is compatible with the surrounding area, harmonious with the character of the neighborhood, not detrimental to the immediate area, not detrimental to the future development of the area, and not detrimental to the health, safety, or welfare of the inhabitants of the area and the County.
- 5. The conditional use permit has addressed all off-site impacts.
- 6. The site is suitable for the proposed conditional use including adequate usable space, adequate access, and absence of environmental constraints.

- 7. The site plan for the proposed conditional use will provide the most convenient and functional use of the lot including the parking scheme, traffic circulation, open space, fencing, screening, landscaping, signage, and lighting.
- 8. Sewer, water, storm water drainage, fire protection, police protection, and roads are available and adequate to serve the needs of the conditional use as designed and proposed.

# **Recommended Conditions of Approval:**

- 1. The conditional use permit shall expire on September 4, 2028.
- 2. The fuel storage tank and piping shall comply with all regulations required by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Oil Inspections Section of the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment's Division of Oil and Public Safety.
- 3. No surveillance radar equipment in aircraft shall be operated within 300 ft of the fueling servicing facility, or other operation in which flammable liquids, vapors, or mist could be present.
- 4. Operation of the facility shall be strictly adhered to as depicted on the site plan. Any changes to the facility or location shall require an amendment to the conditional use permit.

# **Recommended Note to the Applicant:**

1. All applicable building, zoning, health, fire, and engineering requirements and codes shall be adhered to with this request.

Staff sent 203 notices to owners and residents within 2,000 feet of the subject request, and received six responses. Four of the respondents expressed support for the conditional use permit application. One respondent expressed no objection to the request. One respondent expressed opposition, and stated that there was an unresolved complaint about unauthorized landing activities in the subdivision for individuals landing on grass or turf areas in the subdivision. County records show there was an open investigation regarding the complaint, however, there was no information to substantiate the complaint and the case was closed. The Van Aire Skyport also reviewed the letter in opposition and stated that they are unaware of such unauthorized airplane landings in the subdivision.

#### **COUNTY AGENCY COMMENTS**

County staff reviewed the request and determined that the conditional use permit will conform to the County's Development Standards and Regulations.

#### REFERRAL AGENCY COMMENTS

The Tri-County Health Department reviewed the request and had no objection to the application; however, advised the users to comply with fuel storage regulations of the Environmental Protection Agency and the State of Colorado's Division of Oil Safety. Staff has recommended a condition of approval to ensure operation of the facility will be in compliance with the standards of these agencies.

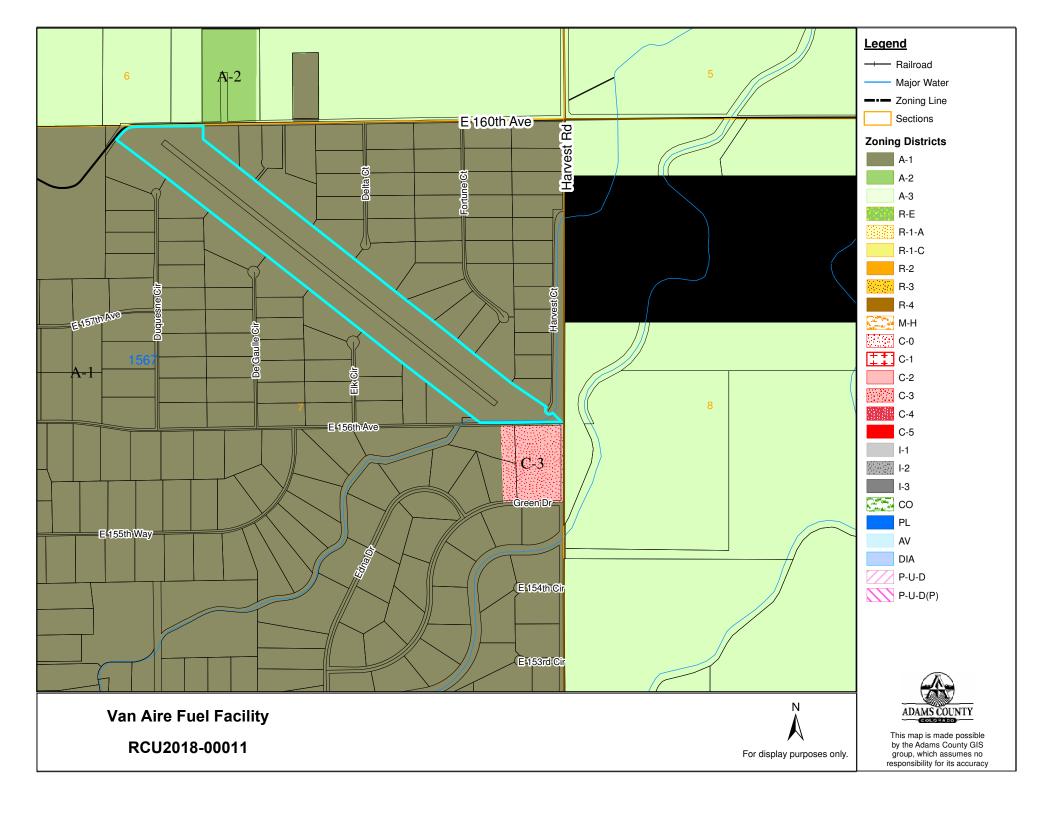


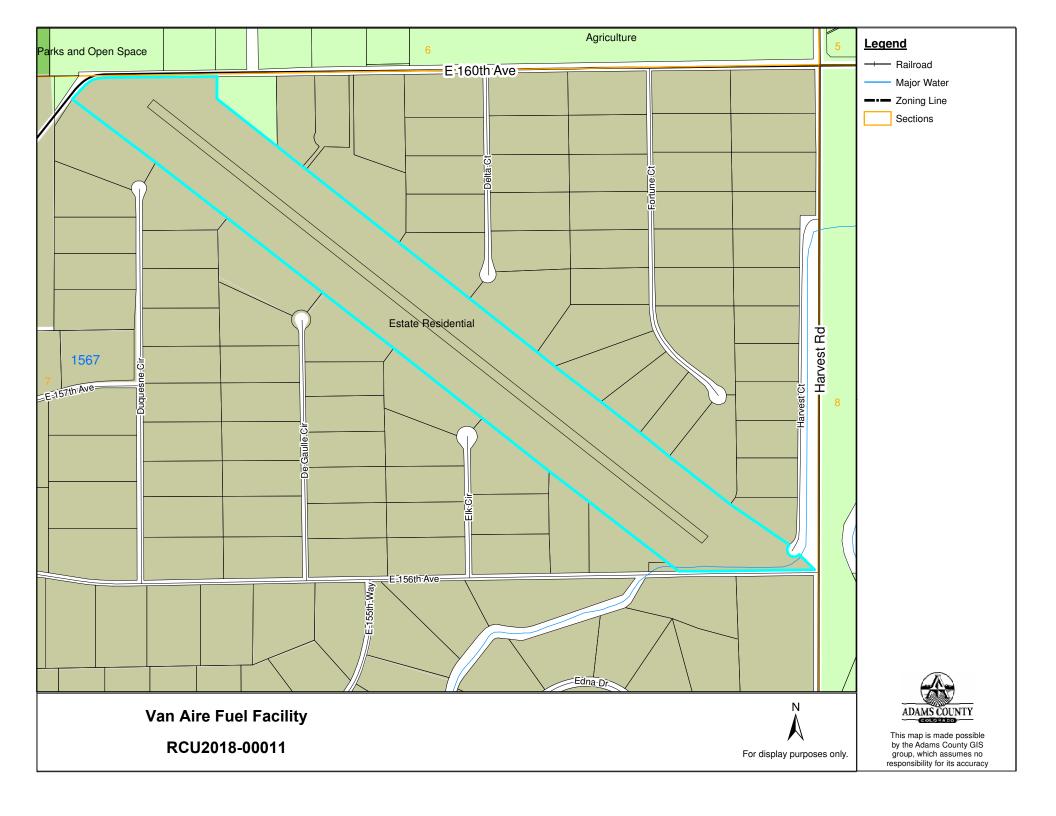


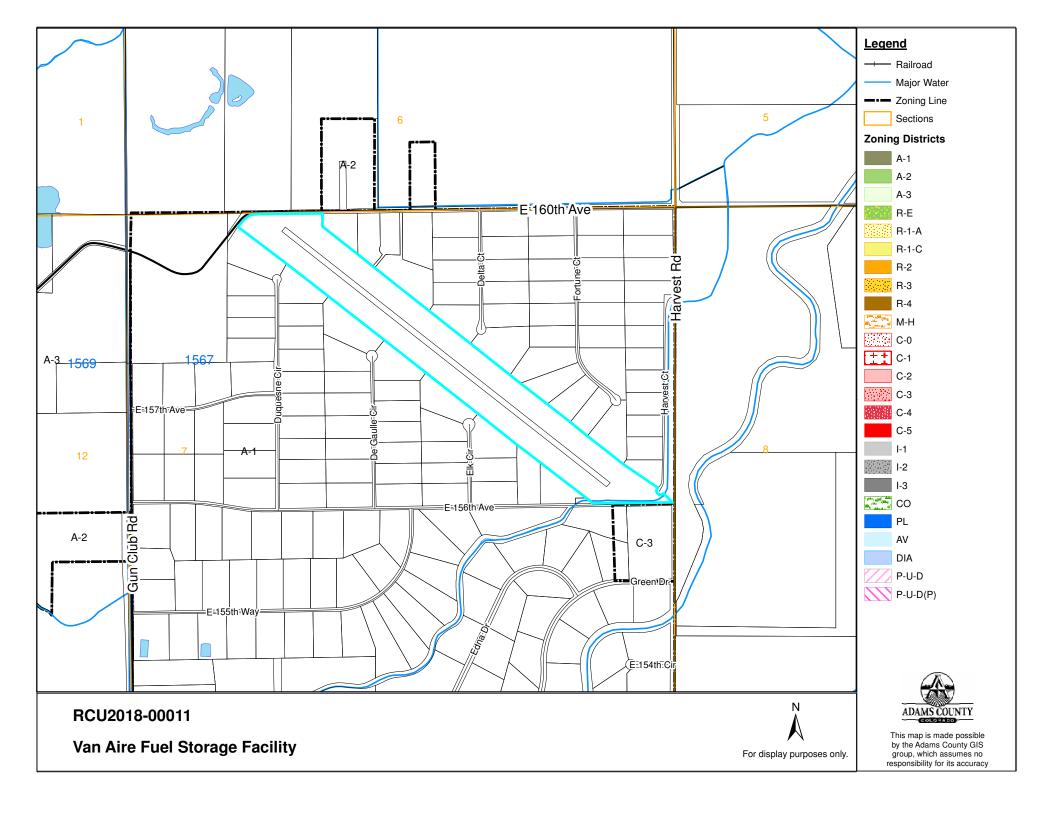

To the Adams County Planning & Development Department:

Van Aire Skyport is located at 24655 E. 156<sup>th</sup> Ave, Brighton, and has current conditional use permit, RCU2012-00042 issued 8/26/2013. In anticipation of the end of the five year permit period, the Van Aire Skyport Corporation Board of Directors would like to apply for a new permit.

Van Aire is a unique airport community and one of only a few of its kind in Colorado, fostering an environment of full immersion in general aviation activities amongst some 80-plus homeowner-members and their families and friends. Established in the early 1970's, Van Aire had to fight for survival when Denver International Airport was being developed and threatened to envelope the airspace around and above it. The FAA saw enough value in the airpark and the opportunities it provides to promote aviation that it agreed to compromise and structure the new restricted airspace in a manner that would accommodate Van Aire. Van Aire has hosted past National Guard exercises and continues to offer the airpark's services as an emergency backup for the county and the FAA, should the necessity arise.

Central to Van Aire's continued success has been the convenience of having a fuel facility on property, which provides the special grade aviation fuel that most aircraft require. The fuel system sits on community property and is comprised of an above-ground fuel tank with a capacity of 4,000 gallons, concrete vaulted and located on a concrete pad surrounded by bollards for protection. There is an 8'x8' building adjacent to the tank for the purpose of housing the tank monitor, credit card machine, and safety equipment. The shed has power and phone service for the machinery and is secured by cypher lock; water and sewer are neither required nor installed. Access to fire extinguishers and emergency contact information are unrestricted in case of incident.

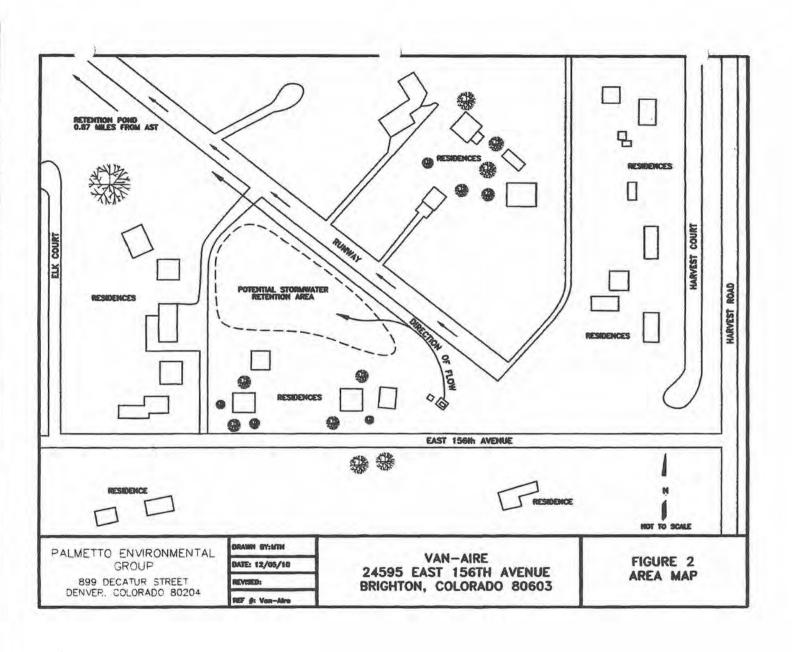
Though the FAA does not regulate private airports, the placement of the fuel system was done in accordance with FAA-recommended best practices at that time of maintaining a minimum 100' distance from the edge of a runway for any potential hazard. The bollards protecting the tank sit at approximately 154 feet from the runway centerline. We continue to exceed the current FAA minimum guidelines.

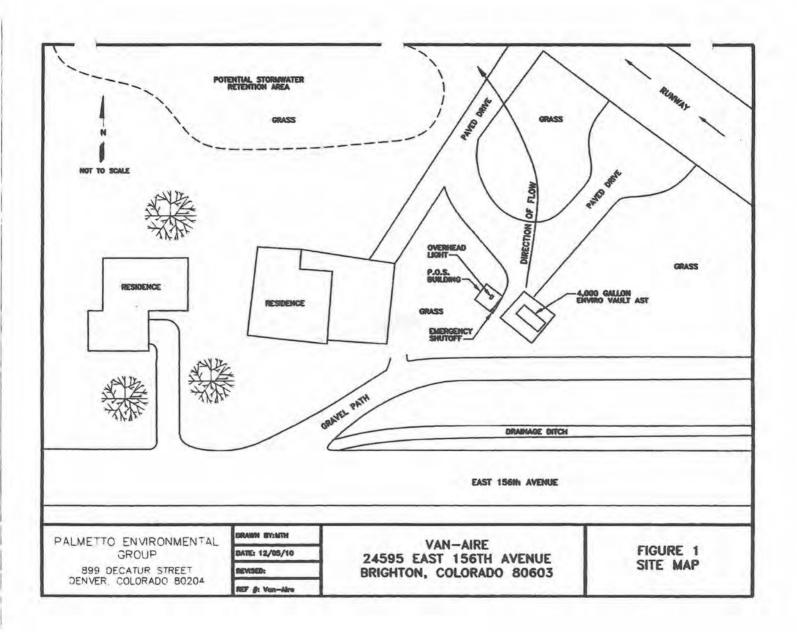
In the five years since Adams County granted Van Aire Skyport the conditional use permit to allow the fuel facility, we have experienced no accidents or incidents and have incurred no violations related to the operation of the system. No changes have been made to the facility that would deviate from the conditions of approval contained in the permit. We have recently updated our spill mitigation and safety program, which has been posted at the facility. The State of Colorado Division of Oil and Public Safety's compliance package review is completed annually as prescribed, and we recently completed an inspection by the Brighton Fire Department to verify that we are in compliance with their requirements.

Based upon the aforementioned reasons, we respectfully request that the Adams County Development and Planning Commission approve a continuation of our conditional use permit, for a term of 20 years.

# **Aboveground Storage Tanks**

Leaking aboveground storage tanks have the potential to contaminate the soil and groundwater around the tank. The fuel storage tanks and piping shall comply with the regulations of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Oil Inspections Section of the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment's Division of Oil and Public Safety. Compliance with these regulations will reduce the likelihood of a tank or piping leak and release of fuel, and provide for detection if a leak occurs. Van Aire Skyport is located at 24655 E. 156<sup>th</sup> Ave, Brighton, and has current conditional use permit, RCU2012-00042 issued 8/26/2013. In anticipation of the end of the five year permit period, the Van Aire Skyport Corporation Board of Directors would like to apply for a new permit.

Van Aire is a unique airport community and one of only a few of its kind in Colorado, fostering an environment of full immersion in general aviation activities amongst some 80-plus homeowner-members and their families and friends. Established in the early 1970's, Van Aire had to fight for survival when Denver International Airport was being developed and threatened to envelope the airspace around and above it. The FAA saw enough value in the airpark and the opportunities it provides to promote aviation that it agreed to compromise and structure the new restricted airspace in a manner that would accommodate Van Aire. Van Aire has hosted past National Guard exercises and continues to offer the airpark's services as an emergency backup for the county and the FAA, should the necessity arise.

Central to Van Aire's continued success has been the convenience of having a fuel facility on property, which provides the special grade aviation fuel that most aircraft require. The fuel system sits on community property and is comprised of an above-ground fuel tank with a capacity of 4,000 gallons, concrete vaulted and located on a concrete pad surrounded by bollards for protection. There is an 8'x8' building adjacent to the tank for the purpose of housing the tank monitor, credit card machine, and safety equipment. The shed has power and phone service for the machinery and is secured by cypher lock; water and sewer are neither required nor installed. Access to fire extinguishers and emergency contact information are unrestricted in case of incident.

Though the FAA does not regulate private airports, the placement of the fuel system was done in accordance with FAA-recommended best practices at that time of maintaining a minimum 100' distance from the edge of a runway for any potential hazard. The bollards protecting the tank sit at approximately 154 feet from the runway centerline. We continue to exceed the current FAA minimum guidelines.

In the five years since Adams County granted Van Aire Skyport the conditional use permit to allow the fuel facility, we have experienced no accidents or incidents and have incurred no violations related to the operation of the system. No changes have been made to the facility that would deviate from the conditions of approval contained in the permit. We have recently updated our spill mitigation and safety program, which has been posted at the facility. The State of Colorado Division of Oil and Public Safety's compliance package review is completed annually as prescribed, and we recently completed an inspection by the Brighton Fire Department to verify that we are in compliance with their requirements.

Based upon the aforementioned reasons, we respectfully request that the Adams County Development and Planning Commission approve a continuation of our conditional use permit, for a term of 20 years.

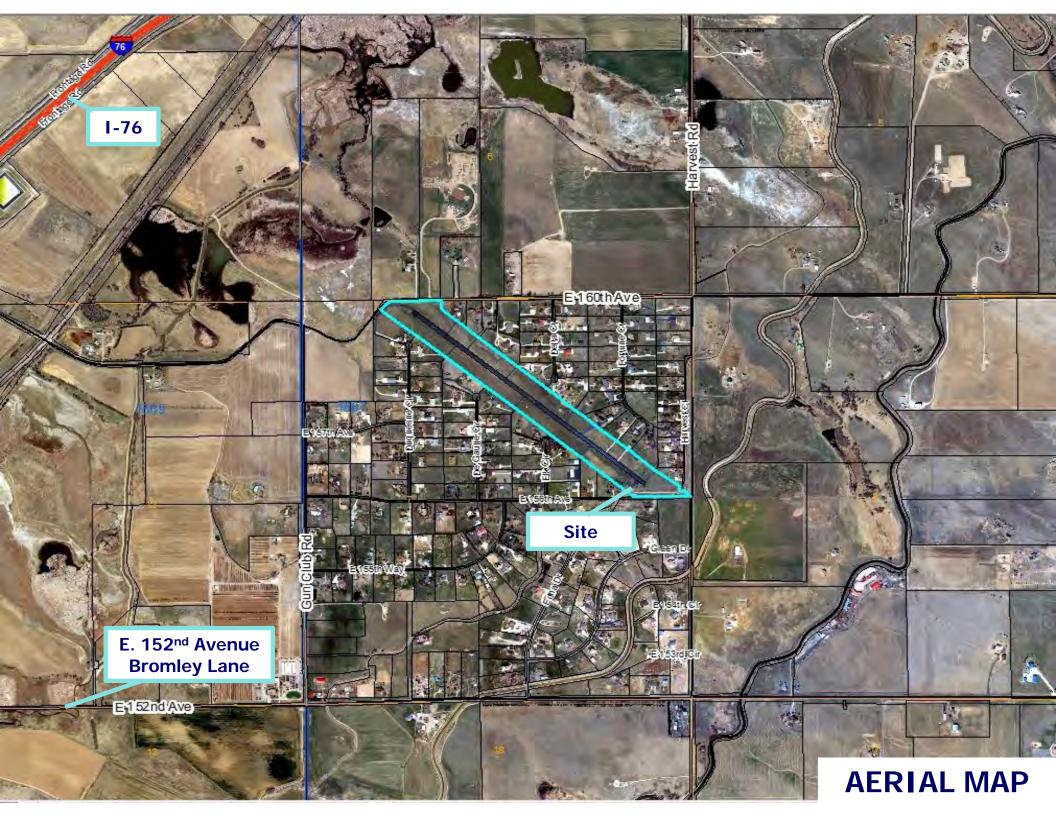

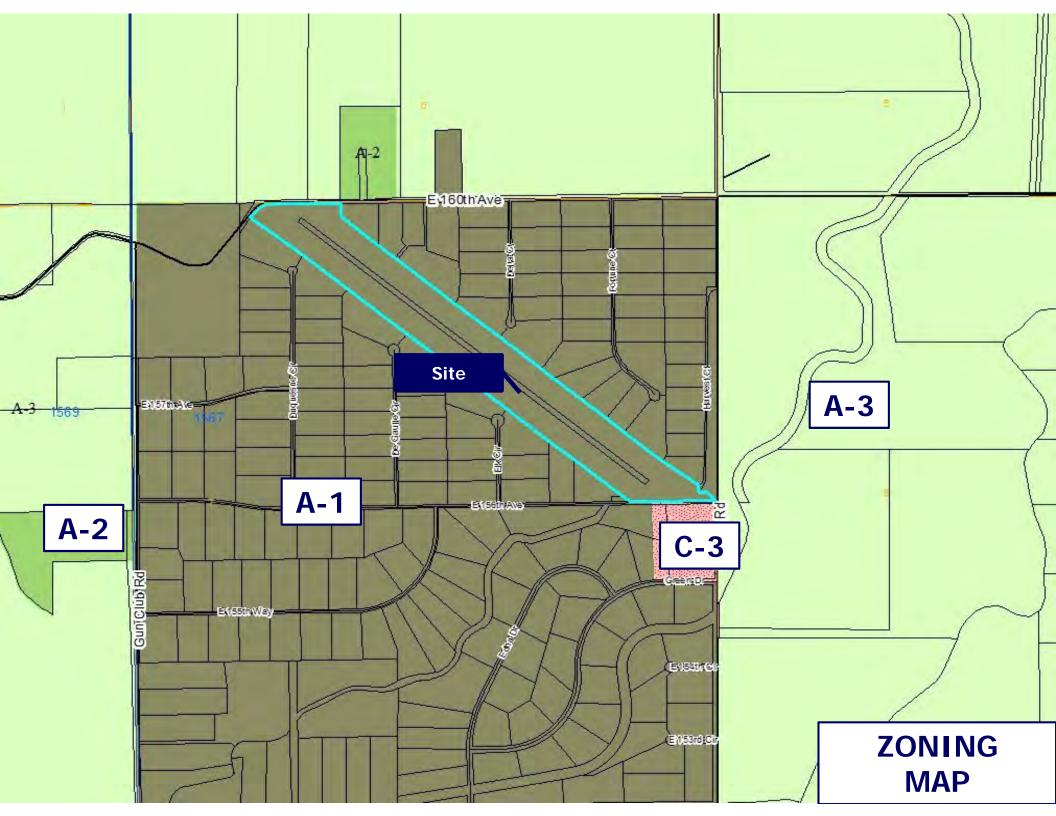

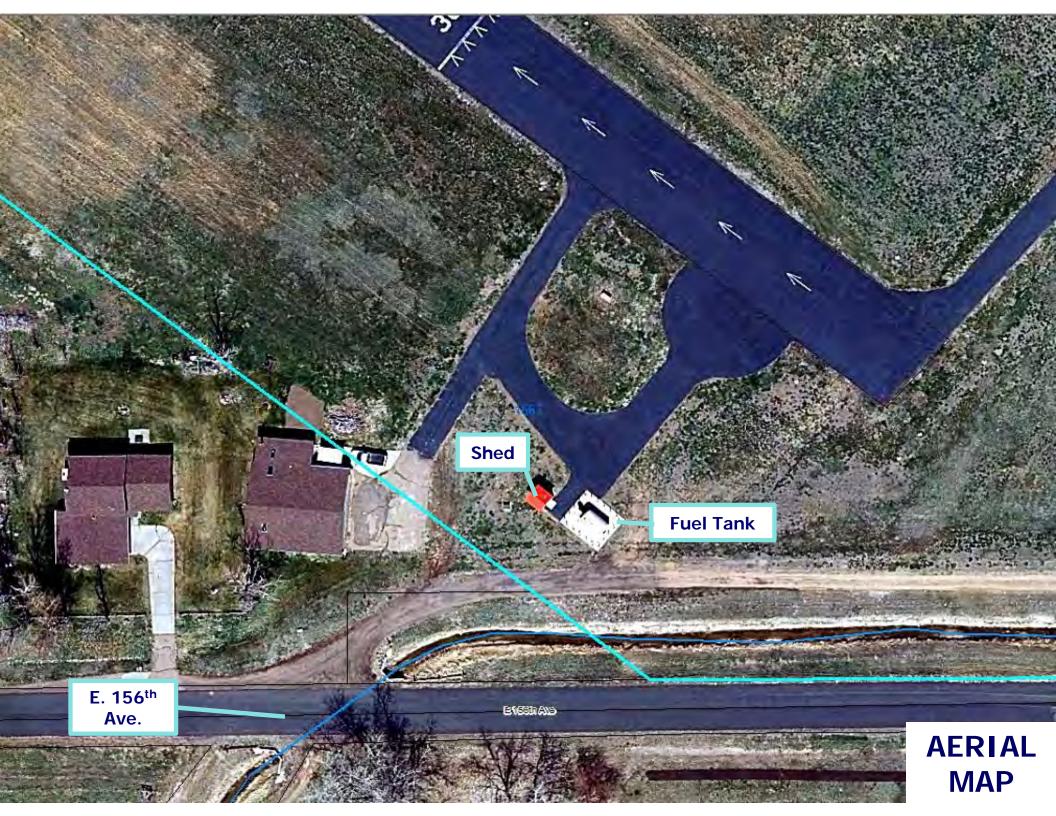




### Criteria for Conditional Use

- Recommended approval of conditional use permit with 8 Findings-of-Fact, 4 Conditions, and 1 Note

### Recommended Conditions

- 1. The conditional use permit shall expire on September 4, 2028.
- The fuel storage tank and piping shall comply with all regulations required by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Oil Inspections Section of the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment's Division of Oil and Public Safety.
- 3. No surveillance radar equipment in aircraft shall be operated within 300 ft of the fueling, servicing facility, or other operation in which flammable liquids, vapors, or mist could be present.
- 4. Operation of the facility shall be strictly adhered to as depicted on the site plan. Any changes to the facility or location shall require an amended to the conditional use permit.
