

| <p>II. Business</p> <p>a. Approval of Minutes for the December 10th, 2021 <i>Motion to approve minutes, seconded and unanimously approved</i></p> <p>b. CSBG Specialist provided an update on board member recruitment. Has reached out to various school district staff who were interested; County board coordinator has reported no applications have been received. Staff and members talked about reaching out to the libraries to post fliers, posting articles in the newspapers, talking to the Commissioners. CSBG Specialist will send link of application to members.</p> <p>c. Members received the financial report as well as the 2021 Annual Report presentation. CSBG Specialist did note to add The Senior Hub to the list on the report. CSBG Specialist submitted the report to the portal, however, the state and federal partners still review to ensure accuracy. In 2021, Adams County CSBG funds served a total of 20,907 unduplicated individuals and 7,779 unduplicated number of households. Some of the services provided:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 94 students (60 high schoolers and 34 of their children) served at Charter School • 293 households received Emergency Assistance • 92 residents with severe illnesses received about 19,810 prepared meals • 19,385 individuals received food boxes • 752 individuals received case management and referrals • Continued support to about 18 Community Partners via staff support (Stephanie Wallace) <p>NOTE: Staff to send presentation to members via email.</p> | |

As mentioned at the previous meeting, regular 2018-2020 grant funds have been spent down fully.



CSBG CARES funding expires Sept. 30, 2022 is 72% spent



Regular 2021-2023 grant funds are 78% spent



While reviewing the financial report, staff and members talked about the CARES funding and agencies not being able to spend at a faster rate, considering it is for COVID/emergency related issues. Staff will continue to monitor agencies and provide alternatives to fund usage.
